

MOTHERS' UNION NEWS

Our Speaker, Bill Lusted, joined us for our service and news time and then continued with his talk which reflected the happiness and privilege he and Kit had felt at being chosen to receive the Maundy Money at Canterbury Cathedral.

The Maundy Thursday Ceremony theme follows Jesus' commandment of service to others in St. John's gospel, chapter 13 verse 34. The opening words of the service are, "Jesus said, 'I give vou a new commandment". The word *Maundy*, comes from the Latin mandatum meaning commandment. The service, led by the Sovereign, was known in the 12th Century. In the 15th Century the number receiving the Maundy money was related to the Sovereign's age and sex, then in the 18th Century the number was increased to as many men and women of the Sovereign's age. The criterion for receiving it is that one must be a pensioner of modest means, who has given service to Church and State and has not been recognised in any other way.

There are two purses, tiny leather bags, containing coins for each recipient (this time 76 men and 76 women). The red purse is in lieu of clothing and provisions and "redemption of the Queen's gown". The white purse

contained 76p of coins. The purses were carried in - held high over the heads of five Yeomen of the Guard on five gold dishes, which this time included a new one with a sun in the middle. In the procession were four children, including a boy and a girl from two local Primary schools. These four represented the men who in olden days helped in the washing of the recipients' feet - this practice was discontinued in 1730. The Sovereign's party carry Nosegays which include herbs.

Two choirs sang, the Chapel Royal in red and our Cathedral Choir in purple.

The Lord High Almoner, who organises the service, is the Bishop of Wakefield and he wears a special linen towel which has been in use since 1883.

The Yeomen of the Guard came in procession and were at strategic points inside the Cathedral.

The service used to be held where the Sovereign was in residence. In our Queen's reign it has been held at Westminster Abbey fifteen times, and Canterbury Cathedral is the only Cathedral outside London to be chosen twice - this time to celebrate her Jubilee and the retirement of Archbishop George Carey.

The processions were wonderful and included the Seneschal (the Steward who formerly paid the workers). The Duke of Edinburgh read the first lesson and this was followed by the Queen distributing the Royal Maundy on the south side. The Second Reading was read by the Dean and followed the distribution on the north side where Bill was seated. The Queen asked Bill about his Military Medal (he was on Sword Beach on D Day, 6th June, 1944).

Following the service Bill and Kit enjoyed a lunch with the other recipients.

Bill wrote to thank the Queen and offered condolences on the death of the Queen Mother.

Bill showed us a photo of himself and Kit, and said "Credit must go to Kit for whatever success I have had in the last 50 years". Kit showed us the coins and purses.

We finished our meeting with members reading some limericks.

The one Bill read was:-

TWO MEETINGS - SAME NIGHT!

The Village Hall Trust's Annual General Meeting and the Parish Council's Annual Parish Meeting will be in Eastling Village Hall - Monday, 28th April.

The Trust's meeting starts at 7.30pm. Apart from hearing about the community hall committee's recent work and future plans, villagers will be able to elect their own two representatives. Anyone who would like to put his or her name forward for election has to be 18 years of age or over. Further details and nomination forms (which need to be returned by Friday, 25th April) are available from Mrs Sue Parry at Magnolia Cottage, Newnham Lane, Eastling, (01795) 890254. Other appointments are for representatives of the hall's user groups. Councillor Peter Parry has been nominated to continue to serve as Eastling Parish Council's representative on the Village Hall Trust for the coming 12 months.

The Annual Parish Meeting will follow the Hall Trust's AGM, around 8.30pm and is expected to last an hour. As in previous years, it will include reports on the work of the Parish Council and local organisations and services. It is also an opportunity for residents to raise matters of local interest or concern. Refreshments will be served after the meeting. For more information contact the Parish Clerk on 01795 539148 or the Chairman on 01795 890793.

VILLAGE GREEN -The Parish Council has agreed that, due to a limited response for villagers to form a working party to prepare a detailed scheme for a village green at Eastling, it is not possible for the project to go ahead at present. Although talked about for over 50 years, a site only became available two years ago. Despite a recent survey of all residents and a 63% vote in favour, only three people volunteered to form a working group at a special meeting called by the Council in March. Whilst Councillors were grateful for this, they took a view that the community needed to demonstrate stronger practical support.

TREE WARDEN - Although he expects shortly to move from the village to Faversham. Eastling's Tree Warden Mike Palmer says he is willing to continue in this role for the Parish Council. However, Mike considers a second warden, based in the village, would help. Anyone interested in knowing more should contact the Parish Clerk on 01795 539148.

Discussing his work, Mike praised the work of the Kent branch of the British Trust for Nature Conservation which supports tree warden schemes across the county. He has benefited from a number of its free training courses. Councillors agreed that they should respond to a recent appeal by Kent BTNC for much needed funding and offer a grant of £75. They also recorded a vote of thanks to Mike for his work on behalf of the parish.

SPEED LIMIT - Enquiries into the possibility of introducing a 30mph limit and "slow down" signs in Eastling village, plus concerns at the omission of local sections of the Eastling-Faversham road from resurfacing works in the coming 12 months is, once more, being taken up with the Swale Highways Unit.

TYRE DAMAGE - Following complaints about damage to vehicle tyres, Councillors agreed to ask the Highways Unit and local landowners to help in resolving problems of damage to vehicle tyres from thorns and other debris left on local roads following hedge cutting, also the large amounts of mud and flints deposited on local roads following field work.

SPOTTED ANY FLOODING?

Residents are asked to report any local flooding spots, from blocked road drains to water flowing off fields, possibly through filled or non-existent ditches. The Parish Council will compile a list and pass this to Swale Council which is carrying out a borough-wide survey. If you can help, information on local trouble spots with the location, the actual problem and how often it occurs should be sent to the Parish Clerk at 12 St Nicholas Road, Faversham ME13 7PG.

FOOTPATH GATES - The Parish Council is to make a contribution of £136 towards the introduction of kissing gates at two stiles on a local footpath. Local walkers had drawn attention to difficulties for those with dogs and toddlers in negotiating the stiles on recently enclosed fields on the steep valley side near Kettle Hill

OSPRINGE PARISH COUNCIL

The installation of the new street light outside Baybanks in Painter's Forstal has now been completed and the pole for the light on the corner of Bayfield will soon be replaced. Various potholes along roads within the Parish should be repaired by the Kent Highways in the near
