Moment by moment....

Deadlines. We all live with them. And in our world as it is today, there is something crucial happening in an hour to hour, minute to minute timescale that is unprecedented and something that only people who lived through war before might have experienced. And so with this deadline for the newsletter, I am writing in advance and who knows what might happen in our world between now and the moment you read this.

We live in moments. And there's something about appreciating the moment we're in which can improve our mental wellbeing. All too often we look backwards to what has been, either good or bad, or forwards to what we hope to be; hope to achieve; hope to see; hope to be. And neither is entirely satisfying because we've failed to live in the moment we're in.

We've heard from across the world many stories of Ukranians forced to live moment by moment –

perhaps looking to the past to what was and might never be again, but also to the future and the unknown. Fear is something that we all might feel in light of what is going on in Ukraine, especially for those living in the midst of the stark reality of war. This fear is real and present right now, in this moment, but theology tells us not to look through, but to look beyond. This war

will not have the last word. Evil will not have the last word.

As we look towards Easter, I can't help but notice the disciples more than ever in the story of Jesus' death and resurrection. What their experience of those moments must have been like. Every day during that week leading up to the crucifixion, journeying with Jesus, from the adulation of the crowds on Palm Sunday to the harrowing scenes on Good Friday, holding moments of wonder and joy alongside moments of fear and horror.

Prayer Pointers April 2022

Mondays - Pray for all living in war torn countries or under persecution.

Tuesdays - Give thanks for our homes, freedom and food and pray for those less fortunate.

Wednesdays - Pray for world leaders that they will rule with wisdom and understanding.

Thursdays - Give thanks for this time of spring growth and pray for a renewal of faith.

Fridays - As Jesus' family mourned his death, pray for all who lost loved ones.

Saturdays - Pray for encouragement and good teaching for all new Christians.

Sundays - Celebrate Christ's resurrection and the promise of eternal life for us.

During each season of Lent, we are also invited to journey through these moments close to Jesus. Looking deep within ourselves to how strong, resilient, courageous, fearful, shameful, sad, joyful, worshipful, prayerful we are in our faith. And moment by moment, we discover new things about ourselves and about the depth of love God has for us, his children, however hard life might seem.

So what can we do with these moments of both fear and wonder in our lives? We pray. We pray for ourselves. We pray for our world. We pray for peace. We pray for hope, that there is a kingdom of heaven and just as the disciples caught glimpses of it, so might we too, in the mundane, in the everyday, in the toil, in the difficulties, even in darkness of war. For if there were no darkness, we wouldn't need to correct our vision to see the beauty of the starry world it contains.

> The vision we all need right now is one of Christ as the one who has the victory. This is seeing beyond the immediate whilst giving God the glory in the present.

So do not be afraid, for God is with you. He will never leave you or forsake you, for Christ came into this world and has overcome the darkness.

May you know this reality in your lives this very moment, and especially this Easter time.





THE ARTISTS WHO OUTWITTED THE NAZIS Presented by MATTHEW WILSON Wednesday 13TH April 2022

Did you know that artists, like the codebreakers of Bletchley, were among the unsung heroes of WWII, and crucial participants at the business end of conflict? This lecture is about two military units from WWII: the British Middle East Command Camouflage Directorate, and the American 'Ghost Army', both of which were populated by artists, specially recruited to devise deception operations that would foil the Germans. For example, the units created fake tanks and depots to fool German reconnaissance planes and draw their attention away from real Allied attack points. They blurred fiction and reality on the field of battle, for the first time weaponizing artistic skills and making for a literal 'theatre' of war. More than this, their ingenious ruses were arguably a critical component of the overall Allied victory against the Nazis.

Matthew Wilson studied History of Art at the Courtauld Institute and has taught the subject in secondary schools for over a decade. 

A testimony: Escaping Ukraine

Alan Sutton, a close friend of Saint Margaret's, Budapest, shares his story leaving his home and son in Ukraine.

"I have been living in Dnipro in central Ukraine since 1997. For most of that time, I have been organist to St Katherine's Lutheran. My house is in an idyllic spot by an inlet off the River Dnipro itself, about 15 miles from

the town where I live with my 19-year-old son, Julian.

We bought a generator as we live outside the city and our water supply is a well with water pumped up by an electric pump. We slowly stocked up with food and fuel. I had a lot of pressure from family outside Ukraine to leave while Julian was adamant that he would not leave; he was born there and lived all his life there.

So, as a compromise, I said I would follow the Embassies and decamp to West Ukraine for a bit, not to L'viv, where everyone else was going, but to Mukachevo - a rather picturesque town near the Hungarian border. There is a daily train to Budapest so I bought a train ticket for the evening of the 24th. I was very lucky. The invasion began in the early

morning of the 24th, and Dnipro received two bombs, one on the airport and one on a radio station.

Thereafter it has been quiet. Long queues formed at ATMs, Pharmacies, Bakeries and Petrol Stations. I thought I would have to stay. Then we found out at the last minute that my train was still running, and so I took it. There were a lot of people at the station but I missed the scramble as I already had a ticket. The other berth in my compartment was occupied by a couple with a toddler who amazingly slept for almost the whole of the way to I viv

The train was blacked out at 8 pm and we travelled very slowly all night, stumbling around in the dark or using mobile phones as torches. We were also rerouted due to an air attack on one of the towns on the main line. While we were travelling, news came through that men aged 18-60 were forbidden from leaving the country, and there was a tearful scene by the couple when we arrived at L'viv as they had planned to go to Poland, but he would now have to return.

I continued to Mukachevo, and the next day was lucky again, getting a ticket from a gentleman who was now unable to travel. He asked me to see his wife onto a train to Warsaw from Budapest, which I did. Since that time, over 2 million have left Ukraine, of which over 200,000 have travelled to Hungary. Most of them are going to wherever they have friends or relatives who can take them in. By far the largest numbers are going to Poland or the Czech Republic where already large numbers of Ukrainians were working.

Almost all are women and children, apart from the sizeable contingent of foreign students. I was very depressed to hear of two neighbours of mine, a mother and daughter, who have a sponsor in the UK who is a British citizen but not family. They made it to Calais, via Moldova and Romania, in a journey far less comfortable than mine, only to be told to go to a visa application centre in Paris, where they have been for three days.



Maundy Thursday is the 5th day of Holy Week.

'Maundy' comes from the Latin word for command, 'mandare'. On this day the Church looks back to Jesus' command to His disciples that they should: "Love one another as I have loved you."



On the evening of Maundy

Thursday Jesus shared the Last Supper with His disciples, before going on to the Garden of Gethsemane and being arrested. It was the last evening He had with them before His crucifixion.

At the Last Supper Jesus shocked His disciples by washing their feet. He did this as an example, to demonstrate to them that they should serve others with humility. Over the centuries, some churches have recreated this act of humility at a special service on Maundy Thursday.

Report from KCC Representative -March 2022

At the KCC annual budget meeting in February, the administration put forward their proposed budget for the 2022/23 financial year. For a variety of reasons, they are in the unenviable position of having to balance the budget to provide more services each year for a growing population with increasingly complex needs; and do so with less money, because although council tax increases each year, the amount received from central government usually falls.

One of the administration's proposals was to cut the current level of subsidy provided for bus services across the county by £2 million. Opposition groups put forward various amendments to try and prevent this cut from going ahead, but sadly were unable to get it removed from the budget. Unfortunately for Swale East, a fair amount of the services proposed to be cut are rural services, and a number of them serve the villages and parishes across our area.

A consultation on the future of these services opened on 20th February and will remain open until 20th April. It can be found online at https:// letstalk.kent.gov.uk/bus-fundingreductions (or tinyurl.com/kentbus on most web browsers).

If you use these services, please respond to the consultation so that your voice is heard.

The services in Swale East in line for cuts

Kent Karrier – formerly known as Dial a Ride, this service provides a vital lifeline for elderly and vulnerable residents in communities such as Throwley, which are already without a bus service. If the other services listed below are cut, then demand (and the need) for the Kent Karrier service would increase hugely.

And the following services currently provided by Chalkwell...

8 - serving Sittingbourne, Bapchild, Teynham and Conyer

332 – serving Deans Bottom in Bredgar parish 343, 344 and 345 – serving Newnham, Doddington, Lynsted, Conyer, Teynham, Bapchild, Sittingbourne and Bredgar

And the following school services...

662 - serving Teynham, Lynsted, Doddington, Newnham, Ospringe and Faversham

664 – serving Conyer, Teynham and Lynsted 666 - from Faversham to Sheldwich

(The 666 Stagecoach bus from Faversham to Ashford will remain in service)

I will be working hard to raise awareness of these proposed cuts over the coming weeks as I believe that the social and environmental costs of losing these services greatly outweigh the financial savings they represent.

I will also be working with officers at the council as I believe the currently stated financial savings have been overestimated. One argument put forward for cutting services has been that bus usage is only at 70% of pre-pandemic levels, but figures I've seen suggest that these routes are seeing 89% of their prepandemic passenger numbers, which underlines their importance to our communities.

I will be holding drop in sessions at the locations and times below for anyone that would like assistance responding to the consultation.


