

### April Message



I watched a programme recently on the first moon walk by Neil Armstrong of Apollo 11 in 1969. Some would say

this was one of the most momentous events in human history. Later I went outside and looked up at the bright moon and thought, how is this possible, I found it hard to believe that someone had walked on the moon - it seemed too incredible.

I imagine that's how many people relate to the resurrection - it's just too bigger leap to believe and just too incredible. Some have even tried to disprove the event as fanciful, a cruel hoax or delusional.

Two Oxford university law professors agreed during their summer recess to review the evidence of the resurrection with the intention of proving it a fraud and discrediting Christianity then to write a book together advocating this view. When the professors returned one said to his colleague, "I'm really sorry and quite embarrassed to tell you that having studied all the evidence, I'm now firmly convinced that Jesus Christ rose from the dead, as claimed, and is alive - so we can't write that book. His colleague said, "You don't know how relieved I am to hear this, for like you, and after much research of the evidence, I have come to the same conclusion." So

the men did write a book together, entitled 'The book that was never to be written', affirming their belief in the bodily resurrection of Jesus Christ.

So, purely based on the evidence, these learned men proved for themselves - beyond doubt - that Christ rose from the grave on that first Easter Sunday. God has been careful to provide such compelling evidence both actual and circumstantial - first to Mary and those women at the tomb, then to the disciples on the Emmaus road and in the upper room - to Peter and John who went to the tomb - and then appearing on 12 separate occasions to his disciples following his resurrection - even to eat fish and chips with them and on one occasion appearing to over 500 people; they each became convinced he was alive.

As Christians, we too are convinced that Jesus is alive and has risen from the grave. We don't need to be embarrassed to believe this, that Jesus is alive, the evidence is so good. The tragedy today is that many people are not willing to look at the evidence, it is there if you really want to find it. It shows that, when we look at the evidence, the Bible is absolutely accurate - we can trust in what it tells us.

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is a demonstration of God's great power and his promise of new life. The resurrection proves that Jesus is, without doubt, the Son of God and of God's revelation to

the world in him. Through the resurrection, Christians believe life has triumphed over death, good over evil, hope over despair - we are living in a moral universe. And because Jesus is alive, the experience of the resurrection means we can have a wonderful relationship with God each day and every day.

I remember a famous preacher who was preaching to a crowd in Hyde Park - and he said "Jesus Christ is alive today!" - and a heckler in the crowd shouted "How do you know he's alive?" The preacher

replied, "Because I was talking with him earlier today". This is the experience every Christian can have - an Easter gift we can



cherish and offer others who also want to know him - in our homes - in our communities - in our work and daily living - as we share this good news. Glory to God in the High Street!

Whether in the evidence or through our experience, God is calling us this Eastertide to trust and turn to him. He is calling us to repentance and to recommit our lives to following his Son Jesus. I pray that we all can say with the Angels and the Saints above.... "He lives, He reigns, He is the Living Lord, who was; and is; and is to come. Alleluia! He is risen, He is risen indeed!"







This lecture shows some of the surprising images that exist in some 400 churches in England, UK and the Continent. The art form was in vogue mainly in the 13th to 16th centuries and rarely includes religious images despite often being placed near to the high altars. After nearly 20 years in the British army, Imogen Corrigan went to the University of Kent to study Anglo-Saxon & Medieval History and Art, graduating with 1st class honours, followed by an MPhil from the University of Birmingham. She works as a freelance lecturer across Britain and Europe as well as lecturing on small cruise ships and running study tours and courses on land and has written Stone on Stone: the Men Who Built the Cathedrals, published 2019. 

### News from Citizens Advice Swale

We're experiencing a busy winter at Citizens Advice Swale, including our energy advice team, which was formed in response to the national cost of living crisis.

Fortunately, with the help of funding from a number of local and national bodies, we've been able to direct energy advice and financial assistance to the most vulnerable in our community as well as to those who've needed extra support in these challenging times.

Since our energy project began, the team has operated through a number of channels, providing face-to-face energy and general advice in local foodbank venues while ensuring we reach out to the most isolated clients by telephone and email. The aim of the project hasn't simply been to help clients access emergency energy funding but to provide a holistic advice service to address clients' specific issues. As important as it is to deliver this short-term assistance, we aim to empower clients to tackle the root of their problems so they're better able to manage going forward.

Although each client has been affected in different ways depending on their individual circumstances, we've noticed several recurring themes from those we've helped.

Single parents with young children have been some of the most affected by the cost of living crisis and they've struggled to afford the high energy costs alongside the rising prices of food, school supplies and other essentials. Many of these parents have found themselves asking for food and fuel vouchers for the first time in their lives and so it's been pivotal for us to assist these clients to help them find the necessary providers of support within the community.

The cost of living crisis hasn't discriminated in terms of age however, with several middle-age and pension age clients struggling to afford expensive energy payments. Many clients in this age bracket have been unaware of the energy support

available, with much of it being advertised on the internet or gov.uk website. We've ensured that such clients are able to navigate the myriad of energy related information that is communicated over the internet and that they're receiving all the support they're entitled to.

Many of the clients we've helped also suffer from multiple health conditions. When providing energy support to these clients we've discovered that many of these clients haven't been accessing the necessary benefits or housing according to their health needs. Our holistic approach to advice has been especially crucial here as we have been able to help the client with several types of issues at first contact and ensure they're then able to receive help from specialists, eg debt and benefits, in our wider local team.

Throughout this project we've found that the majority of our clients requiring energy support are those that pay using Prepayment Meters (PPMs), however many billed customers have also struggled to maintain payments. Regardless of payment type, we've ensured that all clients are receiving any financial assistance that they qualify for in addition to providing practical energy advice to help maximise their income.

### News from Rich Lehmann, **Swale and Kent County Councillor**

I'm acutely aware that in the last couple of pieces I've written I've mainly been talking rubbish (and recycling, and food waste), so I'll change the record this month. The new waste collection contract will commence on Monday 25th March, and because of the widespread changes to collection days across the borough, there will likely be a lot of disruption and confusion in the first month or two, but hopefully the new dates will 'bed in' quickly.

#### **BUDGETS**

Kent County Council and Swale Borough Council have both now set their budgets for 2024/25. The current, widely publicised, financial pressures that councils up and down the country are facing have forced both councils into making difficult decisions relating to the cutting of services, and the increasing of charges for some of the services they provide.

It was an interesting experience for me. I've now spent three years as an opposition councillor at KCC attacking and trying to reverse or prevent cuts made in their budget; but now as an administration councillor at Swale, I'm on the other side of the coin, having to decide (along with other administration councillors) which areas to make cuts in, and then having to defend those decisions. Neither role is easy, or pleasant, and I find the whole process pretty exhausting.

One small silver lining that came out of the KCC budget was that the Faversham Household Waste Recycling Centre, which was threatened with closure in 2023, has been given a stay of execution for the coming year. However tips are still earmarked as a potential area in which the council might look to make cuts in 2025, along with libraries, school maintenance, the Kent Travel Saver (which would cost many families around £1000 without the KCC Subsidy), and "other community services".

Swale have also made some tough decisions whilst attempting to balance their books. Although here it's often more a case of increased charges (such as those for car parking) which appear to be the cause of the greatest concern.

To add insult to injury for residents, the continued reductions in funding from central government mean that both councils are effectively forced to raise their council tax rates by the maximum allowed amount (4.99% for KCC and 2.99% for Swale) just to avoid having to make those cuts even deeper.

I sincerely hope that changes are made in the coming years which mean that local government is given more funding to provide the services that our communities desperately need.

### An Easter reflection

"When you die, that's it. Nothing. Out like a light." That's what the man in the pub said, and his mates all nodded, though the one whose mother had died the week before wasn't really quite so certain. Still, it seemed to make sense.

After all, we know what 'dead' means: dead leaves, dead batteries, dead fish, dead pets . . . and dead people, to be honest. While we recognise that it's all too easy to go from alive to dead, we've got serious doubts about the possibility of any return journeys.

Which is why Christians have an uphill task at Easter. Jesus was a great man, and people want to remember how He died. Fair enough. But it starts getting complicated when Christians insist that Jesus died - but didn't stav dead in fact, that He's alive now. That 'return journey' has happened, they

That's the problem about Easter, Christians persisting in what sounds like a ridiculous belief. If they just dropped the resurrection bit and concentrated on the wonderful teaching of Jesus and His example of generosity, compassion and love then everybody would find Christianity much more believable. Wouldn't that make sense? And wouldn't that fill the churches again?

Well it might (or, more likely, it might not). But in any case, the trouble is that it wouldn't be Christianity at all. The faith of Christians actually depends on the resurrection of Jesus, and always has done, right from the earliest days.

After the crucifixion the body of Jesus was taken down from the cross by some of His friends and put in a rock tomb with a heavy stone rolled across the doorway. Yet the following Sunday, the third day after His death, His followers claimed that they had met Him, seen Him, talked with Him.

So certain was their belief that nothing could make them recant it. Not ridicule, not torture, not even death itself. They couldn't deny His resurrection, because they were

absolutely convinced that it had happened. Plenty of clever and powerful people at the time had a vested interest in proving them wrong. It shouldn't have been difficult to prove that a dead man had stayed dead, especially when you have at your disposal the resources of the greatest empire in history. Yet they didn't do it, because it couldn't be done.

Still today millions of people all over the world believe that Jesus did in fact rise from the dead. They include brilliant scientists and philosophers as well as plenty of 'ordinary' men and women of all ages. They believe it because they respect the witness of those first Christians, and because in many cases their own lives have been transformed by a relationship with Jesus - a relationship that wouldn't make sense if He were dead!

Christians don't put their faith in a dead hero from the past, but in someone who is alive and active in their own lives and in the world. That, in a nutshell, is the real message of Easter.






