August Message

From our Curate, Revd Caroline Turvey

This time last year I had just been ordained Deacon in Canterbury Cathedral. A Deacon, in the words of the ordination liturgy says this:

They are to proclaim the gospel in word and deed, as agents of God's purposes of love. They are to serve the community in which they are set, bringing to the Church the needs and hopes of all the people [...] reaching into the forgotten corners of the world, that the love of God may be made visible.



A Deacon is then 'Priested' a year later in a separate ordination service which happened on Saturday 2nd July. Absolute joy filled the cathedral as eleven of us again made vows to serve God, being ordained to 'lead God's people in the offering of praise and proclamation of the Gospel, sharing with the Bishop, the oversight of the Church, delighting in its beauty and rejoicing in its well-being'.

Lots of words, lots of pageantry, twirling of robes, donning of hats and vestments, and the Archbishop himself preached the question, 'Why all the fuss?' Why do we make it so complicated? In the secular world, there is a natural progression in career, surely this is the same 'what a palaver!' Aren't we just re-enacting a ceremony that happened in the past and meant a lot to people then, but today? Why does it matter? And his answer: because we recognise that God is here. He is involved. The Holy Spirit comes on us afresh and is involved and will equip us for the task ahead to which we are called; to bring others to know they too are loved by God.

This is the next stage on an eternal journey which began with God calling us by name before the foundations of the earth were laid. This journey never ends and we spend an eternity rejoicing in His presence. That's surely worth a fuss and a party in heaven, let alone here!

As Christians, we know that Jesus Christ carries our sin and guilt and all of that is forgiven if we receive his love. This is the truth. That's why there's a great big celebration. The church grows as more and more people discover the truth and accept his love. From just a handful of fearful disciples gathered in a small room after



Jesus died to a small community growing, even overthrowing the Roman Empire without force. And now, today, this community is a 2 billion strong church which continues to grow despite its failures and foolishness. Why? Because God is here. It is true and God invites us all to come in, to commit our lives into the hands of God and to experience the power of Jesus Christ and his inbreaking love through the Holy Spirit.

That's what all the fuss is about. If this idea is new to you and you'd like to know more, then give me, or any of our ministry team a call. We'd love to share the hope we have with you.

That day was so special. It will mark the part of my life journey of which you all are a part. Praise God for each one of you and may you find the life-giving truth of God's party loving spirit, and then go out and celebrate

Speed Limit for Newnham Lane

For some considerable time Eastling Parish Council has been in negotiation with Kent County Council (KCC) to reduce the 40 mph speed limit in Newnham Lane to 30 miles.


Unfortunately, our efforts have not been successful. Despite wide support from our community KCC has advised that an application to reduce the limit is likely to fail.

The reasons listed by KCC are:

1. A speed survey carried out by KCC for a week earlier this year showed the mean speed to be 22.5 mph. The test was conduct at the valley outside Goose Meadow. Only one vehicle exceeded a 30 mph limit travelling at 31 mph at 2 am in the morning.

2. The costs of making an application would involve considerable expenditure for the Parish Council. £2,500 is required to change the statutory Traffic Regulation Order, around £1,000 to erect the sign and a further sum to fund the signage. Whilst some of the costs might be shared with other councils the support of KCC to achieve this was not apparent.

3. There are detailed regulations for what distribution of houses is required to justify a 30mph limit. The pattern of housing in Newnham



Lane does not comply with the regulations. There is rarely an occasion when there are houses on both sides of the road, and considerable instances of open fields or woodland.

On a positive note, the Parish application required a Highway Improvement Plan (HIP) to be presented to KCC. Two items in the plan have been undertaken by KCC Highways Maintenance Department with new drainage on the double bend before entering the village and repairs to the post and pipe fencing on Kettle Hill Road.

The Parish Council will discuss with KCC if any other form of sign might warn users of Newham Lane of its potential dangers to pedestrians and cyclists.



Eastling Telephone Box.

The Parish Council has obtained ownership of our historic telephone box, on behalf of the village. Colin Bell and Brian Williams have beautifully renovated it. The box has tried to house a library but the

books got damp and untidy. Please let the Council know if you have ideas as to possible uses for the box. One idea is a lit Christmas tree in December.

Eastling Primary School

We were delighted to be offered the opportunity, by Swale Borough Council, to take a group of 15 children to Beach school once a week for the duration of term 5. The children from years 2-6 travelled to Swalecliffe beach. They learnt about native and non-native shells, Estuaries and geographical terminology, litter picking, reducing, reusing and recycling. The children also learnt how to hold crabs and identify a wide range of sea creatures.

Wrens Hill Rescue visited the school on 25th April to talk to the children about hedgehogs. The children enjoyed learning about hedgehogs and meeting Wonky.

Willow class were delighted to go to the Living Land show at Detling on 5th May. It was a wonderful day and the children took part in a food tasting workshop, watched a bird of prey display, discovery and machinery workshop, met the animals and watched the sheep show.

The school choir, led by Mr Glazier, went to the O2 on Friday 6th May to perform in the Young Voices concert. This was an amazing opportunity for the children to experience singing and performing with 7000 children. The school was very lucky to have their own box which was situated behind the main stage giving everyone a great view.

Birch class visited St Marys church on Wednesday 4th May where they were joined by Mrs Youle. They had been learning about sacred places as part of their RE topic this term. Birch class also visited the Mosque in Canterbury on Monday 16th May. On Thursday 12th May Acorn class visited Bedgebury Pinetum where they went on the Gruffalo trail.

The whole school celebrated National Outdoor Learning Day on Thursday 19th May. We were delighted to be joined by Wild Classroom for outdoor cooking. The older children had been learning about WWII so they made corned beef hash and homemade beans. Willow class made a risotto with locally sourced greens. Birch class made

pasta and meatballs and the youngest children made Gruffalo crumble (rhubarb crumble). All of the classes spent time planting and enjoying Joey's Garden. Other activities included making bug hotels and preparations for the Jubilee celebrations.

The school held a Jubilee picnic afternoon on Friday 27th May on the school field. Each class was involved and everyone learnt the National Anthem. It was a huge success and was very well attended.

The school sports week was a great success. Over the week the children took part in hockey, Roots to Food, cricket, skipping, boxing (KS2), Miss Sophies' dance, Charlton Athletic, sponsored run and Sports Day. Miss Johnson organised the whole week including sporting trips for each class. Acorn class went snow tubing and tobogganing at Capstone, Silver Birch went climbing and scootering at Revolution Skatepark, Willow class went bowling in Whitstable and Oak class went ice skating at Gillingham. The sponsored run raised £1600 for Abbie's Army.

On Monday 13th July, 15 children enjoyed a day at the Kent Cricket Ground watching a match and taking part in a variety of activities. Other trips in the final term have included visits to Otterden, Belmont, Reculver and the Police Headquarters.

The Friends of Eastling School organised a hugely successful summer fete on Sunday 3rd July. It was lovely to see so many people from the local community. The fete raised an amazing £3000.

Updates from Citizens Advice Swale

Citizens Advice Swale has become increasingly aware of the threat buy now pay later poses to those living on the breadline. A lack of regulation and



easy access to credit, runs the risk of pushing people further into debt while the cost of living crisis looms. Our debt referrals have increased in recent months and we're expecting things to get worse. Since April , we have provided information and advice to over 180 people seeking help with their debts. We have also extended the support we offer to include looking at ways to reduce expenditure, increase income and alternative ways to source credit facilities.

Our Faversham Centre Manager, Jude Lee, said, "More and more people are relying on credit as the cost of living continues to impact on people's finances. Currently many of these are unregulated and whilst they can be a useful way to survive short term, unless they are paid back within the agreement terms, the interest charged on these accounts can throw people into debt.Typical arrangements being used by people to survive daily include Klarna, Paypal, Clearpay to name a few ."



Grace - it really is amazing

Most of us will know the hymn, *Amazing Grace*, by John Newton. Grace is an essential element of our faith, but what is it, exactly?

In everyday life the word 'grace' has many uses: in the courts, a pardoned person has been 'shown grace'; in the arts, an exquisite dancer moves with beauty and grace; if someone undertakes an unpleasant task cheerfully and willingly, it is done with 'good grace' and composers sometimes add 'grace notes' to their music to enhance the playing of their music.

The biblical use of the word 'grace' is quite different! The New Testament describes grace as God doing something for us that we could not do for ourselves. That 'something' is the free and unearned favour of God towards us. It is God's goodness which removes human inferiority and worthlessness and which raises our status. It pays the debt of sin. Grace welcomes the wretched, the weak and the wayward. It adopts us – homeless orphans – into God's family.

The story of King David and Mephibosheth is a remarkable example of grace. (see 2 Samuel 9:1-13) When David discovered a disabled relative of a former friend, he opened the way for this person to be brought into the royal household. He was accepted into David's family and given the same status as one of his sons.

Similarly, God accepts the unacceptable into His Heavenly Family. He accepts us as we are, regardless of status, health - or any objections we may have! Our gracious God loves us even though we are unlovely, undesirable and unholy.

We most see God's love in the gift of His Son. We can only be thankful that through Christ we have a new relationship with God. It is by His grace we are saved.

In John Newton's famous hymn, he wrote 'grace will lead me home'. Through the grace of God we can be assured of eternal life, joy, peace and security with Christ.

KCC COUNCILLOR'S REPORT JULY 2022

There are two updates this month. Firstly, a piece on an excellent local campaign which has the potential to open up a safe cycling route between Faversham and Whitstable, and then an update on the situation with KCC's bus subsidy cuts.



SOLAR CYCLEWAY

The Solar Cycleway is the brainchild of a keen cyclist and local campaigner from Graveney. He came up with a great idea to try and get something positive out of the hugely unpopular solar farm scheme in Graveney by campaigning for the developers to include a cycle path across the site, leading from the creekside path in Faversham across to The Sportsman at Seasalter.

This would make cycling from Faversham to Whitstable significantly safer, as cyclists would no longer have to navigate the fast, winding sections of Seasalter Road from Graveney up to the coast.

I have been working with the Solar Cycleway team over the past year to see what is possible in terms of the laws relating to public rights of way, and our hard work is beginning to pay off. Sustrans, the national cycling charity are now on board with the scheme and keen to assist us, and the scheme has the support of KCC, Swale Borough Council, Faversham Town Council, and the two MPs whose constituencies the path would be in (Helen Whately and Rosie Duffield).

Despite the strong support from every local authority, the developers have so far not budged and not met with us to discuss the idea of allowing a cycle path, but we now have a chance to employ people power to get the Solar Cycleway on the agenda. Although the decision on building the site was taken by the government, the developers now have to get some final

One of these details is a traffic management plan, which makes no mention of the danger their construction traffic will present to pedestrians and cyclists on the Seasalter Road.

Their proposals are currently on the Swale Planning Portal and we are hoping that enough responses about the need for walkers and cyclists to be considered in the plans will put the topic firmly on the agenda. BUS SUBSIDY CUTS

Despite councillors from all parties presenting strong arguments against the council's proposal to cut £2.2m from its bus subsidy budget, the administration at KCC have moved forward with this decision. This will have a huge impact on our area, leaving many villages without access to regular public transport. I am in talks with officers at KCC and other opposition members to see if it's possible to have the decision looked at by the Scrutiny Committee. If we are able to do so, a Scrutiny meeting will take place in early August. I will report the outcome of the meeting in my next piece, and also provide updates via my Facebook page www.facebook.com/ RichLehmannSwaleEast. Assuming the cuts go ahead (which now seems likely), the only public transport option remaining for some villages will be the Kent Karrier service. This costs £3.50 per return journey (regardless of whether you have a bus pass or not) and requires booking in advance. I will write more about the Kent Karrier in the next piece, or if you would like to find out more, search online for 'Kent Karrier Swale'.


