Message for August

Charles Plumb was a US Navy jet pilot in Vietnam. After 75 combat missions, his plane was destroyed by a surface-to-air missile. Plumb ejected and

parachuted into enemy hands. He was captured and spent 6 years in a communist Vietnamese prison. He survived the

ordeal and now lectures on lessons learned from that experience.

One day, when Plumb and his wife were sitting in a restaurant, a man at another table came up and said, "You're Plumb! You flew jet fighters in Vietnam from the aircraft carrier Kitty Hawk. You were shot down!" "How in the world did you know that?" asked Plumb. "I packed your parachute," the man replied. Plumb gasped in surprise and gratitude. The man pumped his hand and said, "I guess it worked !" Plumb assured him, "It sure did. If your chute hadn't worked, I

said, "I kept wondering what he had looked like in a Navy uniform: a white hat: a bib in the back; and bell-bottom trousers. I wonder how many times I might have seen him and not even said 'Good morning, how are you?' or anything because, you see, I was a fighter pilot and he was just a sailor." Plumb thought of the many hours the sailor had spent at a long wooden table in the bowels of the ship, carefully weaving the shrouds and folding the silks of each chute, holding in his hands each time the fate of someone he didn't know.

There are two, maybe more, lessons to be learned from this. Some people may feel they are "packing parachutes". Doing a job that is difficult, or repetitive and thankless. If you feel like that, what you are doing could make a lot of difference to

someone else. Even save their

life.

Everyone has somebody who "packs their parachute". Who does something to help them make it through the day. In our busy world it is easy to forget those people who contribute to our lives and we can miss what

is important. We may fail to say "hello", "please", or "thank you". To congratulate someone who has achieved something or to listen to and sympathize with someone who is unwell or has a problem. After all, isn't this how we would like to be treated?

Jesus said, 'Do to others as you would have them do to you' (Luke 6:31).

News from Citizens Advice Swale

What can you do if a tradesperson doesn't carry out work to the expected standard?

Can you challenge it?

It's always frustrating when you run into problems with home improvements.

If you consider a job unfinished or unsafe, you should be able to get the tradesperson to come back to fix it. If the tradesperson considers the work complete, it's worth knowing you're protected by the Consumer Rights Act 2015, which says they should've completed the work with 'reasonable care and skill'. If they haven't done this, they've broken the law. The Act means you're legally entitled to ask the tradesperson to fix the problem (if they provided the materials as well as the service) or get money refunded (if they just provided the service and you bought the materials).

They should fix the problem or refund you in a reasonable amount of time, without causing too much inconvenience. If you've received the invoice for the work but not paid yet, you can ask them to fix the issue or you can negotiate a lower price for the work.

Let the tradesperson know you understand what you're entitled to. Speak to them in person, or contact them in writing/over email. There are template letters on the Citizens Advice website (citizensadvice.org.uk).

Make sure you have a written copy of anything agreed. Before you contact them, it's a good idea to take photographs to use as evidence of the problem.

Make notes about what happened, including dates and times. You should also gather any paperwork and receipts, including prior written agreements.

If the final cost wasn't in line with estimates or quotes given to you at the outset of the work, there is advice on the Citizens Advice website about steps you can take.

If you're struggling to come to an agreement with a tradesperson, there are other steps you can take to solve your problem including using 'alternative dispute resolution', which is a way of solving disagreements without going to court.








Inability does not equal inactivity

It is perhaps a well-polished truth, but one well worth remembering again: when it comes to salvation, "We were justified by faith alone, through grace alone, but we are not sanctified by faith alone".

In other words, we are made acceptable to God only through the death and resurrection of Jesus, who dealt with our sin. But then the Bible calls on Christians to take their transformation into Christlikeness very seriously. Repentance and conversion and receiving the Holy Spirit into our lives is just the beginning. Now we need to do all we can to allow the fruit of the Spirit to grow in our lives.

From now on, our daily walk is never alone: we are to keep in

step with His Spirit, and to 'work out' our salvation in our daily lives. In other words, obedience to God is fundamental in our Christian pilgrimage.

St Paul stressed this again and again. In Romans 12 he set forth 23 directives to clarify what we must do as we cooperate with the Spirit in our transformation. St Peter adds (2 Peter 1:10,11) "...make every effort to confirm your calling and election. For if you do these things, you will never stumble, and you will receive a rich welcome into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ".

When we truly want to "know Christ and the power of his resurrection", we will see the

News from Rich Lehmann, Swale and Kent County Councillor



This month's piece is a little more functional than usual, and is primarily an update with the latest on the bin situation.

Waste Update

At the Environment and Climate Change Committee meeting on 16th July, the committee agreed to undertake a Scrutiny Review of the Suez contract, which will examine the performance and implementation of the new waste and street cleansing contract, focusing on key areas such as resources, staffing, data management, contract and project management, and communications. To facilitate the review, a Scrutiny Panel has been established. consisting of five members of the Environment Committee, with one representative from each political party.

The review will involve a thorough collection and analysis of data. Members of the panel will engage with officers from all of the departments involved in the contract mobilisation and representatives from Suez. Resident and stakeholder engagement will be a crucial component of the review. The Panel will be seeking input from

residents through area committees, online questionnaires, and a Parish Councils Liaison Forum scheduled for September. Public discussions will be facilitated during Area Committee meetings in September, and an online resident survey may be conducted to gather structured feedback.

The review will focus on several critical areas. It will assess resources and staffing, examining recruitment, training, culture change, staff welfare, fleet and vehicles, and the delivery of new and replacement bins. Data and rounds will also be scrutinised, including an evaluation of precontract data, the IT systems, round routing processes and road access issues.

Contract and project management will be another key focus. The review will investigate the project setup, ongoing monitoring, contract documents, default and rectification processes, and the Recovery Plan created by Swale officers after the first few weeks of the new contract. Additionally, the effectiveness of communications, both internal and external, will be evaluated. This will include preservice resident communications,

reporting forms, social media, and the overall communications plan. The outcomes of the review aim to provide assurances on project delivery, gather and address resident feedback, identify lessons learnt and highlight areas for improvement.

Local Transport Plan Consultation

A consultation has recently opened to invite views on Kent County Council's new draft of their Local Transport Plan.



Reflecting on the Bible (or 'Meditating on scripture')

Many children enjoy boiled sweets - especially trying to see how long they can make them last. The pleasure of holding the flavoured sweet in your mouth is far better than crunching it up in a few seconds!

There is a way of doing much the same with a Bible passage, and it is called Lectio Divina or 'holy reading'. Centuries ago, before Bibles were widely available, the abbot of a monastery would gather his monks together and read to them the Bible passage that was set for the day. He would read it three times and the brothers were encouraged to listen attentively and choose a phrase to remember. They would then go about their daily work in the garden, in the kitchen, in the infirmary or wherever. Through the day they would meditate on the phrase they had chosen and, rather like sucking a boiled sweet, would draw out the meaning for themselves.

You might like to try something similar: choose a passage from the Bible and begin to read it very

slowly as if it were addressed to vou. A few verses from Psalm 103 would be a good place to start.

Stop when a phrase captures your attention. Maybe it touches you in some way, attracts or even disturbs you. Repeat the phrase slowly over and over again, taking its meaning into yourself. Let it sink in slowly. What does it have to say to you? Why do you think it caught your attention? Where is the connection for you? What memories does it evoke? Is there a word, a phrase, a sentiment, or an image that you can hold on to?

Move into prayer, expressing to God the thoughts and feelings that have spontaneously arisen in you. Let your mind be at rest and your heart open to the love and peace of God. When you are ready, carry on with reading the next bit of the passage or just leave it there for the day.

Follow the example of the monks and return to your phrase or phrases during the day.




