Tracey has undertaken a variety of roles since joining as a volunteer just over two years ago and has proven to be a very capable, smart, enthusiastic and committed member of the team.


A member of the Volunteer Response Team Tracey was nominated for her excellent customer support at a recent incident.

The Bishop of London, Rt Revd Sarah Mullally, has said that despite this being a time of "great uncertainty and challenge" as the world struggles to "overcome a devastating pandemic that has cut short earthly lives, destroyed livelihoods, and separated us from the people and activities we enjoy," yet still "we are not without hope."

Speaking recently in St Paul's Cathedral, she said: "Through word, prayer, song and symbol, we are reminded that God's love for us can never be destroyed. God is with us in our pain and fear and will lead us to a yet more glorious day."

Bishop Sarah also praised the ongoing work of the "real heroes and heroines at work in intensive care units, the Emergency Department, oncology and elderly care wards."

"Yet," she went on, "The hope we have in our hearts as Christians is eternal. Hope that is in Christ will not be disappointed."



Why the world was ready for **Christmas**

Ever wonder why Jesus was born when He was? The Bible tells us that "when the time had fully come, God sent forth His Son..." The Jewish people had been waiting for their Messiah for centuries. Why did God send Him precisely when He did?

Many biblical scholars believe that the 'time had fully come' for Jesus because of the politics of the time. The Roman Empire's sheer size and dominance had achieved something unique in world history: the opportunity for travel from Bethlehem to Berwick on Tweed without ever crossing into 'enemy territory' or needing a 'passport'.

For the first time ever, it was possible for 'common' people to travel wide and far, and quickly spread news and ideas. And all you needed were two languages -Greek to the east of Rome, and Latin to the west and north. You could set sail from Joppa (Tel Aviv) and head for any port on the Med. And the Roman roads ran straight and true throughout the empire.

So, the Roman Empire achieved something it never intended: it helped spread news of Christianity far and wide for 400 years. After that, the Empire crumbled, and the borders shut down. Not until the 19th century would people again roam so freely. The time for Jesus to be born, and for news of Him to be able to travel, had indeed 'fully come'.



Kent County Councillor's October Report

I have been asked by several people, including the Editors of two Parish Newsletters to return to the subject of my last months report, changes to the Planning System and Swale's housing numbers.

Since then the coalition Cabinet has approved the proposals of their Local Plan Panel.

Rather than the 217 houses per year proposed under the current Plan the changes are as follows:

Out of an anticipated figure of 1,483 houses per annum Faversham is expected to provide 35% and the Rural Parishes another 10.5%. The coalition Cabinet voted almost unanimously to endorse these figures, including the vote of Liberal Democrat Leader Ben Martin who is elected to represent Faversham. Whether this was a factor in 2 of the 5 Liberal Democrat Councillors subsequently resigning from the Group I can only guess. Our own Boughton & Courtenay Borough representative Cllr Alistair Gould (Green) despite not having a vote as a Deputy Cabinet Member chose to attend the meeting and speak in favour of the proposals!

This would increase the target for Faversham and our Parishes from 217 house per year to 675, a 200% increase or more than three times as many per houses to be completed each and every year.

I note from the Minutes of the subsequent Graveney Parish Council, which I missed due to date and time clashing with another Parish Council in my Division that our local Borough Councillors were of the opinion that these numbers could be accommodated without the North Street development going ahead as they could all be built East of Faversham. Good news possibly for Sheldwich and Baddles-mere but certainly not for Boughton, Dunkirk and Graveney etc.

We must hope that the combined lobbying efforts of Kent County Council and Kent's MPs leads to Government reducing the total numbers although it is purely Swale's Borough Councillors who can allocate the numbers across Swale.

We have recently managed to get away for a few days with our dogs to the Cornish coast, our first break for twelve months. We travelled

> through Wiltshire, Devon and Cornwall with an almost total lack of litter! Why do our roads look so litter strewn?

After over six months of "online "meetings, sometimes up to ten hours a day it has been nice to spend one or two days a week Chairing Home to School Transport Appeals. We have given those parents who wish to the opportunity to meet and discuss with the Panel either face to face or via a web link. Far better for the parents and so much easier to arrive at a fair decision.

This will most likely be my last newsletter you will receive in 2020, a year most of us will be pleased to see the back of. Can I therefore pray that you all have a peaceful Christmas and a Covid free New Year.
