Advent reflection.


John 8:12

Once again, Jesus spoke to the people and said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows Me will never walk in the darkness, but will have the light of life."

The period leading up to Christmas is one that I think we probably all enjoy to some extent. There are wonderful opportunities for communities to gather together to celebrate, to party, to share, to sing and to worship. Churches use this time to connect with those from the entire community because there is a need to celebrate good news of Jesus' birth with everyone. You may be involved in some of the events around the Benefice – singing under a Christmas tree, Christmas mingle, carols by candlelight, Christingle – all of which enable us to be together both physically and spiritually.

There is a sense of anticipation through Advent. There is a sense of wonder for children which can be lost as we grow older. There are difficult times in our lives which can overshadow the joy. It can be hard for families to think about Christmas without a loved one. Many families this year across the globe will be experiencing this sense of loss as we join together after this long time of living with the reality of Covid. This will be part of our Christmas experience as a family as we continue to mourn the loss of Dan's Mum to Covid in January this year. In my years of working within a church context, I have seen people in my church family struggle through Christmas, but there is within them something that is strong, that keeps hoping and won't let the light of Christ be extinguished, even in their grief.

That childlike wonder at the life of Christ is a reality for those whose lives have been enriched and blessed by God who made himself known in this human being, Jesus. Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus on Christmas Day because we know the reality of Christ, not just as a historical figure, but deep within us. We know that this baby grew up to understand his calling as an adult to bring all of humanity into relationship with the God who isn't a far off, untouchable,



distant figure, but a Father, who longs to connect with us all.

Connecting with God in sorrow and in joy gives strength and hope. When we grasp the reality of God through Christ, wonder at the enormity of God's love is once again a possibility. In this countdown to Christmas, this Advent 2021, take this opportunity to ask questions about faith and perhaps even challenge God in prayer over things you're struggling with. We are here to help you find those answers so do seek us out if you need to talk. It's always a privilege to hear from and to pray for you.

Advent is a time of waiting, so what are you waiting for?
There is no time like NOW to discover what Christmas is actually all about.
The invitation is open to everyone in the community to join in and celebrate with us this Advent and Christmas, that we may all discover and know the light, the joy, the love and the hope of Christ in our lives together this year.

Wednesdays - Give thanks for the gifts of the Magi, expensive gifts; we pray for those who will receive no gifts this Christmas



When someone you loved is dead.

Following on from last month, the other lessons that I learned following my wife's death were:

- 11. That it helps to talk about your loss and the person you have lost. Sharing helps you to put things together in your mind, and is healing in itself.
- 12. Don't be afraid of pain, and don't anaesthetise it or avoid it acknowledge it, face it, and you will heal more quickly.
- 13. That crying is normal, even for men, and it is a healing part of the grief process. Don't be afraid of this, even in public.
- 14. It may surprise you, to discover which people draw near to you in your grief, and who steps away. Appreciate those who come closer, without judging those who hold back.
- 15. Not everything people say to you about grief and your response will be helpful. Decide for yourself what is important for you, and let the rest go.
- 16. That grief may expose some of your inner fault-lines, but don't be afraid of this learning more about

- yourself is a gift that comes with grieving.
- 17. No-one grieves perfectly. Following the death of your loved one, you will make mistakes, bad choices, and errors of judgment. This is normal, so forgive yourself.
- 18. That hope will rise again within you. The human spirit, in combination with God's grace, has its own remarkable resilience.
- 19. Don't be afraid to live again. God has a good purpose for you, and a plan for your life.
- 20. That your faith is an asset, not a liability. When you are tempted to be angry with God, remember that He is an ever-present help in time of need. Lean on Him.
- 21. That you have a part to play in your grief journey, so don't be passive and allow it to overwhelm you begin to do what you can to rebuild your life.



Church launches consultation on plans to get to net zero carbon in just nine years

The Church of England is consulting dioceses, cathedrals, national institutions, parishes, schools, and other interested parties on a proposed route map to achieve net zero carbon by 2030.

The draft route map suggests how all parts of the Church of England can make changes together, in order to achieve the ambitious target set by General Synod in 2020: to be net zero carbon 20 years ahead of the Government's targets.

It includes recommendations for building maintenance, heating and the availability of specialist advice for each, setting alongside how the central Church and dioceses can offer support.

The draft net zero carbon route map was written by a sub-committee of the Church of England's Environmental Working Group, chaired by the Bishop of Selby, Dr John

He said: "God's creation is in crisis, and there is an urgent call to address this at every level of our global community.

"Synod has set an ambitious target. We recognise this will be challenging, however many adaptations can also be made simply and quickly, such as switching to a green energy provider, filling gaps in windows, and changing lightbulbs, all of which can help to reduce energy costs. "I encourage individuals and communities to engage with these consultation proposals and to think at every level

what can be done to be part of the change. We need to safeguard and care for all of God's creation."

The Government has committed to a target of net zero carbon by 2050, with an interim target of a 78 per cent reduction, set in April 2021.

Anyone can respond to the consultation online before the closing date of 28 February 2022, with responses particularly requested from Dioceses and Cathedrals. https://www.churchofengland.org/about/environment-andclimate-change/net-zero-consultation

Are you tired?

Increase your joy through human contact. A German study found that people who are most socially isolated are also the most exhausted. Eat right. Nutritionists warn that diets high in starchy carbs and sugar mean fluctuating energy levels. At least half of each meal should be vegetables, fruit or salad. And keep your alcohol intake under control - it can compromise your sleep quality.

Consider vitamins - new research from the Health and Food Supplements Information Service (hsis.org) advises that Vitamin B can help reduce tiredness and

fatigue. Make sure you are eating eggs, dairy products, legumes and seeds regularly. If you are still really exhausted, consider a blood test to check your iron levels.

Exercise. We all know this is good for us, but it is also important to stay hydrated as you do it. Water makes an enormous difference to your energy levels.

Take time to stop and breathe deeply, and slowly. Anxiety can keep us in a chronic fight-or-flight mode, which drains our energy. Calm, deep breathing can halt the stress response.

Be grateful. Make a list of things that you have to be thankful to God for - practise a mental attitude of praise and gratitude towards Him. You will be amazed at the difference it makes!

KCC Member for Swale East - November Report

Back in June when I was still settling into my role at KCC and learning the (many) ropes involved, the pace of things in many ways felt very fast. One area in which I had to get used to a very different pace was the rate at which much of KCC's work gets done. Having never worked in the public sector before, this took some adjusting to. Where my previous roles have largely involved tasks being completed in a matter of hours or days, suddenly I was having to get used to the fact that some things especially those involving Highways - take months or even years.

In the first parish magazine piece I wrote in May, I mentioned that I was working with a number of Parish Councils who were interested in having 20mph zones installed in their areas. At that point I imagined (somewhat naively, as it turned out) that one or two of these might be in place by the end of the year. In reality most of them are still not even halfway towards completion. That's not to say that nothing has happened. Many parishes have had the necessary traffic surveys to see if a 20mph scheme would be viable in their community. If current traffic speeds are too fast then other measures, such as speed bumps or road narrowing, need to be considered. Some parishes have also undertaken informal consultations to get a better picture of the local support for a scheme. In short, things are ticking along, just not at a pace I was previously used to!

The reason I've struggled to adjust so much is that I've always been one to micro-manage projects. Which is fine, and even necessary, when you're a self-employed sole trader dealing directly with members of the public and you alone are responsible for delivering a service to them – but it's an unhelpful approach when things are very much out of your control.

One local case brought this change of pace into focus for me recently. I was contacted by a resident in the first week of June to request a safety barrier be installed by a dangerous bend near their house. I chased up the request with the Highways team and followed up with the resident a month later to see if the work had been completed. It hadn't. I chased up Highways again and followed up a month later. Again no barrier, but an inspection of the site had at least taken place now. Months passed, and then, seemingly out of the blue, I received a mail last week from the resident with a photo attached of the new safety barrier. It was great to know that I had played a small part in making it happen, but at the same time I wasn't the one that installed it: and even though it took months I'm sure there were a lot of very necessary steps taking place behind the scenes to make it happen.

This role feels akin to being the only visible cog of an enormous machine. It can be frustrating to not have control over the pace at which things happen, and even more so to have to say no to people making very reasonable requests (usually on the grounds that the budget simply doesn't allow it), but on those occasions where you play some small part in improving things for residents, it can feel incredibly satisfying.
