'm writing this in November amidst the tragedy of war and the remembering those in war past whilst wondering what this Christmas will be like around the world. The questions probe deep into our consciousness. For Christians. Christmas is a time of joy and celebration, thinking particularly of the incarnation of God in humanity as Jesus Christ. God amongst us, beside us, within us. The hope of humanity lies at the heart of the Christian message. That Jesus came as a gift of love to a broken world bringing light to all seems difficult to conceive when we see the pain and suffering of nations torn apart.

Jesus himself knew poverty. He was born at a time of unrest in the Roman Empire, his family fleeing while he was a child through the borders of Israel to safer lands in Egypt. Has the story changed that much over 2000 years?

But we continue to live with hope. In the midst of chaos, we catch glimpses of that hope through international organisations that go into the world to bring aid. I particularly admire those working for the charity Médecins Sans Frontièrs – incredible people, bringing medical help on the frontline of wars around the world, risking everything to help others. Amazing.

That is what Jesus was about – helping people in front of him, those visible and invisible, transforming the individual both physically and spiritually.

So what can we do on our frontlines?

Currently, we have a team of people working towards launching a project called 'Growbaby' in the New Year. We all understand the concept of a foodbank and have been giving generously to these for many years. Growbaby is a similar idea which enables those who have young families to be able to access



good quality children's clothes from a central source for free. This will all be stored in Lynsted Church – our hub for Growbaby.

We are at the beginning of something that feels right and has come from our Benefice as a response to the difficulties in our current social climate. If our remit as Christians is to seek justice for the poor and the oppressed, then this gives us that opportunity to work together for this cause and essentially, God's Kingdom here on earth.

How can you help initially?

- We need good quality children and baby clothing (age 0-5) that you no longer need.
- We need people to help wash, iron and sort the clothing.

Perhaps you might consider buying something new as a present to someone you don't know.

- We need financial donations to be able to offer hospitality to our visitors and to purchase other essentials as and when needed.
- We need people to offer spaces as 'drop off' points for donated items.

On 9th November 2023 a special Service of Dedication of a new memorial stone took place in the churchyard of St. Mary, Eastling.

Private Sydney Court was the son of Ethel Lucy Court of Eastling and was husband to Gladys Barbara Frances Court of Newnham Lane, Eastling. Before the war Sydney worked as a baker's assistant for the bakers in Eastling Street and lives with his grandparents in Newnham Lane in what is now Magnolia Cottage.

Sydney joined up with the Royal East Kent Yeomanry at Faversham on 29th January 1914 and saw service towards the end of the Gallipoli campaign and unfortunately contracted typhoid shortly after this, being hospitalised Alexandria before being repatriated

Family stories say he spent some time at the Western front, where he was gassed, although the only surviving records for him do not confirm this as they are primarily his medical records from later in the war. Many soldiers' documents were destroyed by enemy bombing during the second world war and so the story is not complete. He was transferred to Ireland and this is where, because of his war service, he contracted TB in January 1918. He was transferred to the Lothians and Border Horse in September and discharged in April 1919.

Sydney married Gladys whilst convalescing at Woodbridge in October 1918 and their first child Lionel was born whilst living with Gladys' mother in Hammersmith in April 1919. They moved to Eastling to live with Sydney's grandparents (whom he thought were his parents) in Newnham

Lane, where their second child Jim was born in September 1920. Sydney died of TB on 15th June 1921.

Private Sydney Court was buried elsewhere in the churchyard in 1921 and the new stone has been provided by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission.

North Downs Walk - final figures better than expected

The Rotary Club of the Weald of Kent held its annual North Downs Walk on Sunday 11th June. The weather was great and the results are better than originally estimated.

The event is a sponsored walk in aid of Cancer Research UK and the walkers' own choice of good causes. Walkers may choose to donate 50% of their sponsorship to their own nominated cause, or all of it to CRUK. There is a choice of routes from 1 mile (fully paved, therefore suitable for wheelchairs or baby buggies) to 9 miles including a climb up the North Downs

which attracted a full range of ages and abilities of walkers, including Brownies, Air Cadets, keen hikers and Active Retirement Associations. Of the 357 walkers, some had preregistered and downloaded sponsor forms via the Weald Rotary website and others entered on the day, making a donation to CRUK. With all the sponsorship money now collected and counted, the confirmed totals exceed the early estimates. Including Gift Aid, the total amount raised was £27,000. £17,700 was donated to Cancer Research UK and £9,300 to 26 other good causes nominated by the walkers.



Weald of Kent Rotary have been running the North Downs Walk for 38 years, missing only 2020 due to lockdowns, and plan to continue running it as long as there are walkers. The 2024 Walk will take place on Sunday 9th June.

KCC Household Waste Recycling Centres

After much jubilation last week at the news that KCC's proposals to close Household Waste Recycling Centres (including the site at Faversham) appeared to have been binned, it seems the celebrations were premature. As opposed to the speculation in the papers at the beginning of the month, news came directly from KCC on Wednesday 15 November that the plans were merely on hold rather than scrapped. Given the amount of media coverage the story received across Kent, it seemed highly unlikely to me that the leadership would push ahead with the plans against the wishes of the majority of councillors, but given the financial strain the council is under perhaps they see it as unavoidable.

From the outset, the plans never appeared to be fully thought through. I opposed them at length during my group leader's speech at the KCC full council meeting in May and also through my role as chair of the Environment Committee at Swale (a role I'd only been in a few days when the plans were first announced!). If they do resurface. I hope they are accompanied by suitable levels of data and evidence to try and justify how such a backward looking proposal could be considered during a climate and biodiversity crisis.

Arguments about the size of the Faversham tip which were put forward when the plans were first revealed lead me to believe that KCC will still be looking to close the Faversham site. With this in mind, I will continue working in my dual roles at both Swale Borough Council and Kent County Council to see if a better site can be acquired for a Recycling Centre fit for the future, which will be even more necessary if plans for an additional 2500 houses on the South East corner of Faversham come to fruition.

Local Walking and Cycling Infrastructure Plan Consultation

Still on the subject of consultations, KCC currently have a consultation open on their walking and cycling plans for the county. The plans include 30 key routes across the county which are proposed for improvements.

There are three key areas in Swale earmarked. Most relevant to our area is a proposal to improve the cycling route along the Lower Road between Faversham and Sittingbourne. It's a route which can feel fairly dangerous in places for cyclists (and sadly saw the death of a cyclist near Tonge last year). Also featured are plans to improve walking provision around the northern side of Sittingbourne and cycling provision across the northern coast of the Isle of Sheppey.

How to - Stop mist on your windscreen

If you will be out in your car a lot this Christmas, here's an easy way to stop your windscreen from misting up:

Simply clean it with shaving foam. It provides a protective barrier which stops mist forming. Ice hockey players use it to stop their face masks from steaming up while they're on the ice.

It's easy to do. Put a good dollop of shaving foam onto a clean towel, and then wipe it all over the windscreen. Then take a second clean towel, and gently wipe off the shaving foam. This leaves a protective barrier, but it will need to be regularly reapplied, to continue to work.
