Animal Blessing Service "All Creatures Great and Small"

to be held at St. Lawrence's Chapel, Otterden Place. ME13 0BU

Sunday 22nd June at 3.30 pm.

Please bring your pets, ponies and other animals to Otterden Place Chapel.

We are aiming to hold the service in the churchyard if the weather allows, so please bring picnic rugs and fold up chairs. Trailers containing larger animals can be reversed up to the churchyard wall to overlook the churchyard, please park cars on the other side of the pathway by the chapel. If it is wet smaller animals, will be welcome in the chapel.

The service will be relayed through speakers, with the Rev Paula Jardine-Rose blessing all the animals both inside and outside the churchyard. Pet cages may be appropriate, with all dogs on leads please. Owners must be in control of their animals at all times! Kindly take your own litter and that of your pets' away with you when you leave.

There will be assistance to guide you on arrival at Otterden Place - head for the chapel at the top right-hand side of the Park. You are welcome to picnic in the grounds/churchyard before the service, but no BBQs and no smoking in the grounds. There is a standpipe for water in the churchyard.

Please arrive in good time to be ready for the service, gates open from 2 pm.

Message from our Rector

As I sit and write this, we are in the grip of a very nice warm spell of weather.

I think a bit of blue sky, hearing the birds in the hedgerows and feeling a bit of warmth on our skin, makes us feel much better. We feel uplifted and ready to get into action after the darkness and chilly weather of winter and spring. Summer is here (for a while at least). Yet the ground is exceptionally dry. We have to manually water our plants and our farmers are desperately in need of a bit of rain to bring on the crops, and pasture for the livestock.

We too can find that we need 'watering'. Spiritually we can feel dry and thirsty, but it is at this time of year that we remember and celebrate Pentecost, which saw the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples of Jesus.

Some of us may know this time of year as Whitsun, likely a derivation of 'White Sunday', the day that the Holy Ghost or Holy Spirit descended upon the

gathered disciples. We now tend to call it Pentecost from the Greek for 'fiftieth' being 50 days from Easter (including both Easter and Pentecost). The Holy Spirit was not only poured out upon the disciples, but it continues to be poured out among us, it is the 'active' part of God, if you like. This active Spirit dwells within us, and if we allow it to, we can be moved to do God's work; to help those in need. to pray for and with people, to seek to build relationships with our communities and to grow our own faith.

So like a plant that is freshly watered, let us all regain our strength and purpose in God's created world. Let us flourish, let us put on new growth and nurture those new shoots to ultimately produce the fruits of the Holy Spirit as defined in Galatians 5, which are Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness and Self-control.

May you all have a blessed time of renewal.



Like Father, Like Son

'Dead Ringer' is the odd phrase we use when referring to someone who looks like somebody else. Sometimes, instead, we say 'spitting image' when we see a likeness or similarity between one person and another.

This month includes Fathers' Day (15th June) and is an occasion when dads are particularly remembered by their children. As far as the boys are concerned, how many have heard someone say 'Oh, you really look like your father'? One day, Jesus was talking to His disciples and said, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father" (Jn 14:9) What an


amazing statement! Jesus was saying that He was the dead ringer or spitting image of God! At another time Jesus said, "I am in the Father and the Father is in Me." (Jn 14.10) These words must have shocked His hearers, for He was saying that He was equal with God. No one had said anything like this before, but certainly His miracles were proof that He was different. No-one else could do what He was doing. Some people wondered—could He really be who He said He was?

So Jesus attempted to make His position clear and said, "If you knew Me you would know the Father also."(Jn 8:19) The people were being urged to know Jesus more. They had to look, listen and

believe. Were His deeds of God or not? They had to decide!

Today, we all stand in a similar position. Who is Jesus? Do we look at Him and say 'Yes, this is God in the flesh' or 'No, He was just a good person - but also perhaps, deluded or crazy?'

Thomas, the disciple with the nickname 'doubter', exclaimed: "My Lord and my God" (Jn 20:28). Thomas was convinced that he was in the presence of God, in human form. And when the Apostle Paul wrote to the church at Colossae he said clearly: 'It was by God's own decision that the Son has in Himself the full nature of God' (Col 1:19). Like Father, like Son!



The letter below arrived just too late for inclusion in the May Good News, but is still relevant today. Ed.

Dear Parish and Town Councils,

My apologies for the blanket email, however this is the quickest way I can contact all of you and hopefully prevent anyone becoming victim of a current concerning fraud. Over the last couple of days Kent police have received various calls from Swale residents reporting that they have received phone calls from someone claiming to be a police officer. They give a fake police officer name and force number and state they are part of the Economical Crime Team at Sittingbourne Police Station (There isn't such a department). They claim there have been some irregularities spotted within the bank account of the person they are calling before requesting the person hangs up and calls the police. The criminal pretending to be a police officer will keep the line open their end and when the poor victim calls 999, they will pretend to be a police call taker where they then ask for the victim's bank details.

This type of crime is highly sophisticated, and the criminals are well trained in what they are doing. Please can you all spread this message far and wide and if there is anyone with access to local Facebook Village pages, please can you ask they publish this on there so we can warn as many people of this scam and prevent people becoming a victim of this. There have now been 10 calls from Swale residents today alone and these are only those reporting it; there will be many more and unfortunately it is quite often that those who become victims of this type of crime don't report it through embarrassment. The calls have thus far very much been targeting the elderly and the pattern appear to be alphabetical through the phone book for those with Swale addresses.

Please feel free to attach the below link to any post you can send out of which details what to do if you are unsure as to whether the person calling you is a genuine police officer.






News from Citizens Advice Swale

First time Renting?

Are you thinking about renting somewhere for the first time?



Most properties available for rent are listed online or with lettings agents. If you have the chance, renting directly from a landlord might be a bit cheaper before you move in, as they may ask for fewer references and you might not need to do a credit check. You'll have to deal with them directly if any issues arise during the tenancy. Some landlords use a lettings agent to find their tenants and then manage the properties themselves. If an agent is managing the property then you'll deal with them rather than with the landlord directly, for instance, if you need to get any repairs done. Never pay any money before you've seen the property as this is a common tactic used by rental fraudsters. If you can, take someone with you when viewing properties for a second opinion.

Ask the landlord or letting agent some key questions to make sure properties you're considering are safe, affordable and meet your needs.

- How much is the rent? Is it payable monthly or weekly?
- How long is the tenancy for?
- Are bills included in the rent?
- Are any appliances or furniture included?
- Is there a break clause allowing any fixed term to be ended early, if needed?
 - Does the landlord need a guarantor?
 - Is there a tenancy deposit, how much is it, and how will it be protected?

It's also good to ask whether the tenancy is for a self-contained property, or whether there are shared facilities, whether or not it's a joint tenancy with other people and, if relevant, if you can have pets. Make sure you're happy with the arrangements.

Check if you'll need to pay a holding deposit while the landlord carries out pre-tenancy checks. A deposit can't be more than a week's rent and should be returned to you at the start of the tenancy. You should also ask your landlord or letting agent what documents you'll need to provide when you agree to rent the property including evidence of your Right to Rent. Avoid 'subletting' which is when you rent directly from an existing tenant, as they might not have the landlord's permission to rent to you. If a tenant is showing you around the property on behalf of the landlord they should give you the landlord's contact details.

If a landlord refuses to rent to you because of who you are, this may be discrimination - for example because of your race, religion or sexual orientation. A 'no kids policy' or refusing to rent to you because you get benefits could also be discrimination. You only need to tell a landlord or letting agent you receive benefits if they ask.

News from our County Councillor

I'd like to take this opportunity to say a heartfelt thank you to everyone who put their trust in me to represent Swale East at KCC for another term.

During the campaign, I had the privilege of speaking with residents from almost every village and community across Swale East. I met hundreds of people who told me they were intending to vote for me and the Green Party, and about as many who were not. Regardless of how people intended to vote, I was eager to listen to the concerns and hopes that are shaping our community right now. To the many who I had conversations with who told me they supported Reform, I want you to know that I will be representing you as well, and I genuinely share many of your frustrations.

One thing that I felt far more clearly than when I campaigned in 2021 is the level of frustration that exists in our society now. We find ourselves surrounded by a media environment that thrives on outrage and division. Especially in the news we access online, which relies on views for ad revenue, so creates headlines designed to catch people's attention. In some areas this is relatively harmless, even if frustrating, such as with the torrent of stories which appear online every October and November telling us that three feet of snow are on the way, despite the chances of it happening being virtually non-existent.

In other areas it can be far more serious. The riots which took place across England last summer were sparked by misinformation about the identity of the perpetrator of a horrific crime, and whilst the misinformation was not shared by mainstream news sources, it did fit with a narrative which has been running for

years in many corners of the UK's media, driven by provocative and divisive headlines and articles.

This is problematic. At a time when we need to be coming together and supporting each other more than ever, it's disheartening to see how easily we can be pitted against one another, when what we truly need is unity and compassion.

It's also clear that many people are feeling upset, anxious, or even ignored and left behind by their politicians. I completely sympathise with those feelings. The sense of being unheard or overlooked is deeply unsettling, and it's something I've heard time and again on the doorstep. People are looking for real change, and after 14 years of Conservative government marked by austerity and hardship for many, there was hope that a Labour government would bring about that change. Sadly. the decisions made by Keir Starmer's government have left many feeling disappointed and angry, and that

frustration was palpable in so many of the conversations I had.

While I don't agree with some of the solutions put forward by Reform in their campaign literature, I do agree that there are important issues we need to talk about openly. Too often, people feel shut down or unable to express their views. Social media, which should be a platform for connection, is probably the worst possible place for meaningful discussion on these complex issues - especially with those we disagree with.

Unlike some politicians, I'm happy to be honest and say that I don't have all the answers. These are complicated times, and the problems we face don't have easy solutions. But I am committed to listening, to representing everyone in Swale East, and to working towards a community where everyone feels heard and represented as far as possible. 

Restoration of Bangor's Bible Gardens

Bangor's historic Bible Gardens are undergoing a significant transformation as part of the city's 1500th anniversary celebrations, with preparatory work already underway.

Located next to Saint Deiniol's Cathedral, the Bible Garden is being reimagined in collaboration with Bangor City Council and the Cathedral.

Originally established in 1961 by Dr. Tatham Whitehead, then Professor of Botany at the University College of North Wales, the green space was designed to feature plants and trees mentioned in the Bible. Dr Whitehead's research identified 148 plants referenced in the scriptures, with the garden attempting to cultivate as many of these species as possible.

The restoration project is based on the original design and planting scheme from the archives. Substitutions of more climate-resilient species will be made where necessary.
