

Epiphany for today

This month we celebrate Epiphany, when we remember the Magi from the East who followed a star to find the baby Jesus: *'Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews?'* (Matthew 2:1).

At the start of a New Year, amid the uncertainty of the pandemic, are we asking the same question? The gifts they offered show us how we can find Him in the uncertainty of the coming year: 'they bowed down and worshipped Him...and presented Him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.' (2:11).



The *gift of gold* reflects that the Magi saw in the baby a king, destined to rule over us all. In this coming year we need to remember that Jesus is on the throne, the seat of power and authority in the whole universe. Will we crown Him king of our lives and dedicate to Him all that we are and do?

The *gift of frankincense* reflects that the visitors saw not just an earthly king, but God in human flesh. Incense symbolises the prayers of God's people and so this gift reminds us that God is worthy of our worship and prayer. Will we offer our praise and prayer as we seek God to guide us through the uncertainties of this time?



The *gift of myrrh* reflects that these astrologers saw beyond the baby's birth and life to His death which would secure

life for all. Jesus was offered myrrh on the cross and it was a spice used in His tomb. As we face the sufferings of this New Year, we can be confident that Jesus knows and understands our experience. Are we ready to trust Him?

'Glorious now behold Him arise, King and God and Sacrifice! Heav'n sings Hallelujah: Hallelujah the earth replies.' ('We Three Kings').

In the story of Noah's Ark we see that God is equally interested in rescuing the human and the non-human from the threat of disaster. In fact the Ark is largely full of all the other species - with very few human beings on board! God also makes it clear that the animals, birds and creeping things are not simply included for Noah's sake, but because they have value in their own right. They are to be included "to keep their various kinds alive throughout the earth" (Genesis 7.3) In other words the God who made every creature and who sustains all life on earth is committed to what today we would call 'biodiversity conservation'.

Moreover, when God sends the rainbow as a sign of his Covenant promise, it is a promise that includes more than Noah and his descendants. Time and again in Genesis 9, God repeats that his covenant is with 'every living

creature on earth', with 'the earth' (v.13) and with 'all life on earth' (v.17).

Somehow, our salvation theology as Christians has become too small. It has focussed largely on God's

saving plans for me and people like me, and forgotten that God might have a bigger picture. Noah reminds us that God has plans that are far bigger than us. As St. Paul reminds us in Colossians 1, Jesus' saving work was "to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood shed on the cross" (Colossians 1.20). 'All things' includes the nonhuman creation, reconciled brought back into relationship - to God through Christ's saving work - human beings also have a job to do.

The final thing that Noah

reminds us of is how we human beings fit into God's bigger plans for the whole creation. From God's perspective we are not simply one randomly evolved species amongst the millions of others. We have been set apart with a particular role and calling within creation. At the time of

the great flood God had a plan to save people and other animals, and he could have implemented that plan by himself. However, he chose to use a human being – the creature made in his image – to fulfil his plans. Noah was the first great conservationist, but in another sense he was also the first great missionary. He was the first person to whom God gave a specific calling and job description - a mission to fulfil. Noah's mission was very specific you and I are probably not called to build large wooden boats. Yet the wider picture looking after God's creation is something we are all called to. Back in Genesis 1 and 2, the creation accounts show God's very first words to human beings as a call to responsible leadership within creation. In 'The Message' version of Genesis 1.26-27 God says: "Let us make human beings in our image, make them reflecting our nature, so they can be responsible for the fish in the sea, the birds in the air, the cattle, and, yes, Earth itself, and every animal that moves on the face of Earth."

This responsibility for creation's welfare is fundamental to who we are as human beings. It is not about having a 'dominion' that results in domination and exploitation. It is rather about reflecting God's image in how we exert our rule and responsibility for creation's well-being. Therefore we can truly say that wildlife conservation as for looking after his planet, is an essential expression of Christian mission.







How many more waves?

As the days are dark, and winter still stretches ahead, many of us find the prospect of more restrictions for months to come even harder than when we first went into lockdown.

After nine months of coronavirus, we are emotionally drained. We are financially drained. We are lonely, depressed, frightened, and facing deep uncertainty, from job losses to health problems to relationship breakdown. We are running out of steam, and the virus is still going strong.

There is a strong parallel in all this with the ancient book of Job and his experience of loss and pain. Like Job, we are discovering that we are not always entitled to health, wealth, and happiness; and like Job our suffering inexplicably goes on and on. Like the irritating moralising of Job's comforters, the constant critique of the media only seems to make things worse. And, like Job, our minds are incapable of totally grasping the meaning of all this suffering. We need hope.

Job was deprived of everything, yet even in his despair he never lost his belief that God was there. Occasionally an indestructible hope burst forth like a ray of light in the darkness of his pain. "I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end He will stand on the earth. And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God.' (Job 19:26).

But the truly transformative moment for Job came when, instead of seeing his situation in front of God, he finally *saw God in front of his situation*. Then, even in the intensity of his suffering, the greatness of the Almighty eclipsed the problem. That is the revelation we need.

In this sad and weary time lament is therapeutic, and we can be completely real with our Father in Heaven. Yet in our lament, the path to rekindling true hope lies in the possibility of focusing on the character and immensity of God. Greater is He that is in us than the pandemic that is in the world.

Join in with the ancient words of Psalm 42: 'Why are you downcast O my soul? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise Him, my Saviour and my God.

The first man to get stopped for speeding...

It was 125 years ago, on 28th January 1896, that Walter Arnold of Kent became the first person in the world to be convicted of speeding. The speed limit was 2mph at the time, and a man carrying a red flag had to walk in front of the vehicle. But one day Mr Arnold took off at 8mph, without a flag bearer. He was chased by a policeman on a bicycle for five miles, arrested, and fined one shilling.Mr Arnold was four times

over the rather modest 2mph limit in the streets of Paddock Wood, near Tunbridge Wells in Kent. To achieve this feat today, a driver in most towns or cities would have to be travelling at over 100mph, which is probably a bit excessive. The speed limit was changed later that same year to 14mph, but there is no record of Mr Arnold getting his money back. Nor is there any evidence that he was endangering life and limb, which used to be the

criterion: the 1832 Stage Carriage Act introduced the offence of endangering someone's safety by "furious driving". Just over 100 years later, the road safety charity Brake reports that male motorists are more than three times as likely as women to having driven at more than 100mph, because 'boy racers' believe they have more talent than the average driver. Police have caught one driver doing 120mph in a 20mph zone, another doing

152mph in a 30mph zone, and one doing an astonishing 180mph on a motorway. As Edmund King, AA president, points out: "Generally men have riskier attitudes towards driving than their female counterparts."
