Here is James Freed's report.

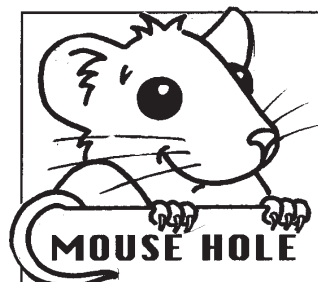
On Saturday the 21st of May 2005, Eastling Puppet Club went to a competition in Guildford.

Then it was the competitors turn (We were only allowed 5 minutes!). Eastling did the story of Adam and Eve and won a bronze.

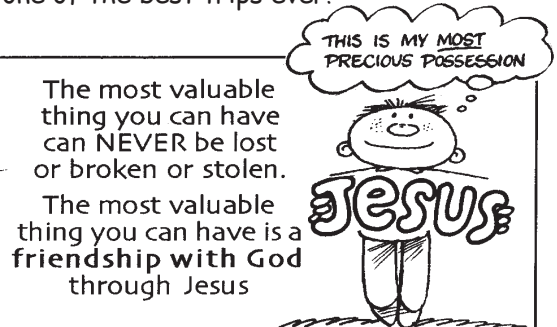

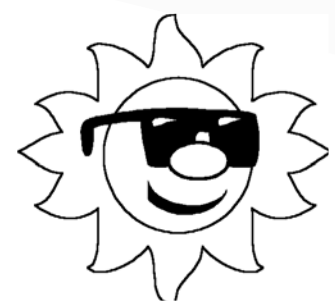

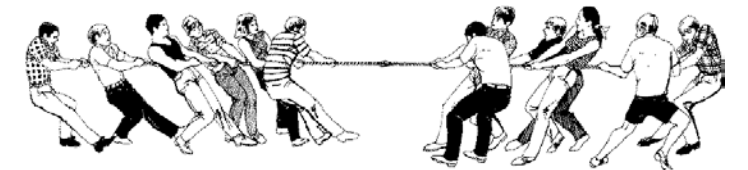

A Bag Lady.

While working for G.E.C. Marconi at Rochester Airport. I volunteered to help in a new scheme to help the homeless in the Medway towns called 'Winter Warmers' using the old nursing residence at St. Bart's Hospital, Rochester, which had been empty for some time. It was made warm and welcoming with new doors, plumbing, heating, water and electricity reconnected.

A safe and warm bed and a hot meal for the night, only open through the winter months from 4pm until 10am.

My part was to collect from my firm's restaurant, at the end of the working day, meat pies, sandwiches, yoghurt, drinks, fruit, cakes etc. that had not been sold, then take them down to the centre to be distributed to all who wanted something to eat during the day out on the street. Men, women, boys and girls, who for whatever reason found themselves without a home.

Little did I know at the time that I, too, would experience being without a home. The sale of my house in Gillingham had been completed but, before I found a house in Faversham, I was temporarily without a home. My furniture was stored with three of my good friends from my church MFC, my belongings with my family. I slept at friends' homes in the week and went at weekends to either my daughter or my sister, carrying my change of clothes in bags.

At first it was an adventure but as the months went by, it was hard not knowing when I came out of work which direction I had to go, who's house was I going to. But eventually it all fell into place and I

moved into my house in Faversham. What did I learn from this experience? To count my blessings, to pray, to be thankful for the love and support of my friends and family, to be grateful for all the gifts with which God has enriched my life. Lots more went on at that time, I had to trust in God and I did. He has surrounded me again with love and support.

Prayer is for the 'religious'?

It is true that much prayer does take place in Church but prayer goes so much further than that. If friends or family are afflicted by problems, whether medical, financial, emotional or whatever else, then we will want to help. Often though, that help seems beyond us; what can we do?

When we face these problems ourselves - again, what can we do?

In both instances there is a simple remedy that will, in money terms, cost you nothing. The answer really is this simple -

Don't just stand there, pray something!

You might think you can't do this because you are not even sure that your prayer will be heard. But still there is a feeling that you really would like to pray somehow.

What if you could go to a church and have someone pray for you and with you?

You could bring to the church the problems that are worrying or frightening you and someone would pray for you. This will be careful, sympathetic, and completely confidential. The results of receiving prayer like this are often very moving, sometimes very powerful indeed, and almost always helpful.

Even if you are not sure about the existence of God, the people praying for you serve as His way of communicating with you. He knows you and loves you.

Ospringe Parish Council

Ospringe Parish Council meeting on the 25th May.

A programme of maintenance and repairs to the Champion Hall has been proposed. The areas that need particular attention are the roof, the guttering and the windows. The Parish Council supports this work and will assist with funding.

The work to install kerbing to protect the village triangle from road traffic has been completed. The Parish Council is giving consideration to the replacement of the white posts.

No planning applications were received by the Council this month.

The Council received a report from the auditors. In addition to assuring financial propriety, the auditors review the general performance and governance of the working of the Council. The auditors' report into both areas was favourable and the auditor has signed the accounts. The Council thanked the Clerk for her work in preparing the accounts.

Ospringe Parish Council meeting on the 15th June.

The Council is reviewing the cost and quality of the Street lighting contract. The Council has authorised work to repair the light in Bayfield.

The Council were very pleased to receive a report from the Amenities Committee that the two Benches they purchased, from funds raised at the Summer Fete, have been placed in Lorenden park.

The Council continues to work with Swale Borough Council to get a newspaper recycling bank located in the Painters Forstal. The Council see re-cycling as an important part of managing the local environment.

The Parish Council next meets on the 13th July, 7:30 at Champion Hall - when the public are invited to attend.
