Message for the Month from Revd. Jim Pye

A man told his wife not to get her hopes up for her birthday. "After all," he said, "The celebrations are only going to last half a minute." "What are you talking about?" she asked. He replied, "Well, it's your thirty-second birthday."

Celebration. I put this into google and the first four links came up with the Kool & The Gang song. 'Celebrations' had many links, equally divided between chocolates and the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. I had been thinking about the latter and this article, and wondering what we could celebrate next. From a nationalistic sports perspective Wimbledon and the World Cup don't seem promising. From a church calendar point of view there isn't a lot. We are counting up the Sundays after Trinity until we approach Advent, though there is Harvest and All Saints.

Why should we celebrate? One google link led me to this... Celebration is an ancient ritual. It gives us a way to feel good about ourselves, and our accomplishments. When we celebrate we are reinforcing something important to us. Without it we simply maintain the status quo and candidly have a lot less fun.

So celebration is good for us. One of the difficulties of lockdown was the inability to mix with others and this brought mental health problems for many people. The Bible is full of celebrations. This includes Sunday worship, to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus, as well as seasonal events like Pentecost. Jesus said he had come to bring abundant life (John 10.10) and that has to include celebration.

How should we celebrate? Nehemiah 12.27 gives us some guidance At the dedication of the wall of Jerusalem, the Levites were sought out from where they lived and were brought to Jerusalem to celebrate joyfully the dedication with songs of thanksgiving and with the music of cymbals, harps and lyres.

These celebrations were planned, dedicated everything to God, and joyfully brought God's people together with thankfulness.

As well as large, organized events, we can quietly and individually celebrate with God for everything. 1 Thess. 5.18-19; "Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. Do not put out the Spirit's fire." We can put out the Spirit's fire by being unthankful and ignoring what God has done for us. There is a hymn which includes the words "Count your blessings, name them one by one; Count your many blessings, see what God hath done." If you ever feel down, start listing your many blessings. Perhaps this is something you can do at the start of each morning, just before you throw off the bed covers and get up, or as you brush your teeth!

The Revd Richard Higginbottom looks at the seashore.

If you are fortunate enough to get to the seaside this summer, then you might like to wriggle your toes in the warm sand, and consider the following: It has been said that there are more stars in the universe than there are grains of sand on all the beaches in the world. More recently, as the estimated number of stars has increased. then even the grains of sand in all the world's deserts have been added to the comparison! The Sun, vast though it is, is a fairly ordinary star, 93 million

A sermon in sand

miles away. It is not easy to grasp that sort of a distance, but here's a measuring stick: if you were to fly in a fast passenger jet at 600 miles per hour, then it would take you about 17 hours to fly from London to Sydney; about 17 days to reach the Moon, and about 17 years to reach the Sun! As for how long it would take to fly on to the next nearest star to us - Proxima Centauri - it would take about 4.2 light years, as the distance is more than 24 trillion miles! And that is just to the next nearest star after the Sun.

How many stars are there in the Universe? Astronomers recently estimated that there are about 70,000 million, million, million stars. As you sit there you might care to pick up a couple of grains of sand. Let the first grain represent our Sun, the second grain the next nearest star to us. Then look at the whole beach and after that consider all the beaches on Earth, with every grain of sand representing a star then it gives some meaning to the phrase "God the Father *Almighty*, Maker of heaven and earth."

Day Surgery

Wearing my own dressing gown over the hospital regulation smock and with my belongings in a bag by my side, I was waiting my turn for a four-hour operation, to be preceded by a general anaesthetic. If all went well, I would be discharged and allowed home that day.

Time went by. Gazing round the anteroom I spotted a shelf with half a dozen baskets holding files: one file per patient awaiting surgery. On the front of each basket, in large letters, was a label with the name of their surgeon. Every one of those names would have been unfamiliar to me when I was a boy in England, for they were all of Indian, African or mid-European origin. My surgeon was born in Romania, and having found as much as I could about her via Google, I was encouraged to know she was world class in her specialism.

Were these medics British citizens, or highly skilled migrants allowed to settle in the UK temporarily because of their worth to our community? They were expert and caring to a fault.

Now I'm home. It's too early to say if the operation was an unqualified success, but I feel fine and have discarded the pre-signed form which acknowledged the risks involved.

Waking up in my own bed the next day, I was overtaken by a sense of gratitude to God, into whose hands I had committed myself, and to friends who were praying for me. I had also committed myself into the hands of a myriad of other people, my fellow human beings. Many were immigrants or descendants of immigrants, who are now crucial to the National Health Service. Nearly half of the new nurses and midwives registered to work in the UK in the past year have come from abroad. My GP was born in Germany and the consultant who fitted a stent in my heart some years ago came from Pakistan. I'm thankful they are here.

I wonder if any of the youngsters crossing the Channel in flimsy dinghies right now will become NHS consultants one day.





From our County Councillor - June 2022

Well, one year into the role and what a rollercoaster of a year it has been. So much so that the below was originally due to be my councillor update last month, but I couldn't find the time to write it.

A year ago when I was fresh faced and two weeks into my tenure, the first piece I wrote for our local parish magazines shared a few of the ambitions I had in mind for my four years in this role. Among them were 20mph limits and roadside verges. Two areas which, at the time, I thought might be possible to make good progress on in my first year. Sadly these tasks both turned out to be more complicated than I had realised.

To get a change in speed limit there are a number of hoops to jump through, each of which can take several weeks. Progress has been slow, but I'm pleased to have assisted a number of parish councils to varying degrees in moving their requests forward. Sheldwich will hopefully have a long overdue 20mph limit on Lees Court Road by the end of this year, and, if all goes well, other parishes won't be far behind.

Letting roadside verges grow long is another area more complex than I'd originally realised. Despite KCC's vocal support of No Mow May via their 'Kent's Plan Bee' campaign, many verges across our area were unnecessarily cut back during May 2021 and May 2022. In some cases there was a necessity to maintain sightlines for road safety, but in many more this wasn't an issue. KCC are in a tough position on this topic as public opinion is still greatly divided. Recent studies suggested that Kent has seen a 70% reduction in insect life over the

past two decades, so we really should be doing all we can to try and reverse that worrying trend. I will continue to push for KCC to reduce their use of glyphosates and leave verges that don't impact on highway sightlines.

I would be lying if I said that my first year as a councillor hasn't been tough. My hair is now greyer and I've gained a few lines on my forehead and inches around my waistline. That being said, the second half of the year was far more enjoyable than the first. The incredibly steep learning curve I started out with is beginning to level off and I'm able to respond to many more enquiries without having to go round the houses to get an answer. More importantly, this knowledge has bolstered my confidence in dealing with KCC related matters.

Regardless of political leaning, our local authorities work best for everyone when opposition parties can provide strong and effective scrutiny of the administration. In February I submitted a motion at KCC's budget meeting which prevented the cost of school bus passes being increased for families with children in receipt of free school meals. This was voted through by the council and the cost of a pass for those families should remain frozen for the next three years.

All things considered, my first year has been a case of finding out just how much I didn't know about local government, and then filling the gaps. I still have a lot to learn, but am looking forward to being more proactive as time moves on and I really get to grips with the role.
