I once received an e-mail written by a man with children. His mother had always been there for him and he had a high opinion of her. After she died he found this poem in her drawer.

The son was distraught and filled
with guilt when he remembered

and unconditional acceptance. He wrote the e-mail to encourage others to appreciate their loved ones before it is to late.

Jesus stressed the importance of having a right relationship with people. He even said that it was important to put our relationship with others right *before* we worshipped God (Matthew 5:24). He also said that we are to love other people as we love ourselves (Matthew 22:39).

All too often I discover unresolved family conflicts when I meet bereaved people to discuss funerals. In the busy world that we live in relationships can easily be sidelined. Perhaps there is someone you have had a disagreement with, or maybe you have just failed to tell someone how much you appreciate them. Can I encourage you to contact that person today, go round and see them or phone them to put your relationship on a right footing. Don't leave things until it is too late.

# Announcement made in our Churches on Sunday 16th July 2023

#### Dear all

I wanted to share with you all an announcement that was made at all our Church services yesterday (16th July): It is very much with mixed feelings that after what will be just over 15 years in Kingsdown & Creekside and over 4½ years in High Downs that I am announcing today, my retirement from full time ministry in September. God has blessed us with so much over these years and both Jane and I will miss being here with you. However, under God, we feel it is now time for us both to be able give more to our families and all of our 11 grandchildren, none of whom were born at the time of my original licensing in Kingsdown & Creekside on 18th September 2008. My last Sunday in the Benefice will be 17th September when we will have a Benefice Service, back in Lynsted, where that first licensing took place. I am reminded at this time that we are all part of God's Church and God is faithful.

Going forwards from October the Churchwardens remain in responsible in their roles as Churchwardens and 'in charge' bearing in mind that we are all part of one Benefice with the 2 parishes of High Downs and Kingsdown & Creekside. Both Parochial Parish Councils have appointed Lay Chairs (HD = Steve Youle, K&C=Bruce Leckie) as they do every year. Jim, whilst part-time, has a wealth of knowledge from 30 years in full-time ministry and Caroline continues in her Curacy. The Archdeacon (of Maidstone), Andrew Sewell has already spoken about his office's availability in support during the interregnum.

Archdeacon Andrew will be leading the process of preparing for, advertising for and appointing a new incumbent following my retirement.

I continue to be very grateful to our Ministry Leadership Team who take responsibility for our Services in each of our Churches and they will continue to be able to lead us in

our worship as a Benefice.

Our Speaker this month on 7th June, was supplied by the Guide Dogs organisation, Pat Marshall. She is completely blind and was accompanied by her Guide Dog Rosie, a Labrador cross Golden Retriever, and husband Richard who live at Kennington.

Pat was an excellent Speaker, very knowledgeable on the workings of the Guide Dog organisation, particularly as she is now on her second Guide Dog. Obviously not being sighted, Pat spoke naturally and with passion from memory, with only the occasional prompt from her husband. The recipients of Guide Dogs have everything provided by the organisation, so there is no outlay for them. This is very expensive, so hence the need for considerable fundraising. During the Pandemic there were no

litters bred, no training and of course no income, so there is now a waiting list of several years for a They aim to have Guide Doa. around 500,00 dogs working this year.

The puppies are purpose bred at their Leamington Centre and at 7 weeks old, they are then placed with a Puppy Walker for basic training and socialising. At 12 to 14 months the dogs then go for their formal basic training and then onward to a hotel in Hove to finish off with Advanced training. all takes several years, depending on the individual. Interestingly there is a 75% success rate, with the remaining 25% being rehomed with other organisations or private homes. We asked Pat to speak for 30 to 45 minutes, but she was with us for considerably longer such was the interest shown by the ladies present!





# **KCC Councillor's Report**

In a break from tradition, I'm going to deviate from my usual county councillor column this month and write a single column as a combined borough and county councillor or 'twin hatter' (the description used in political circles). Normal service will be resumed next month.

First of all, I'd like to say a huge thank you to the residents of Boughton and Courtenay for putting your faith in me and electing me to represent you at Swale Borough Council for the next four years.

As you may be aware, shortly after the elections I was elected to be the Chair of Swale Borough Council's Environment Committee, a role which not only covers climate change and other 'green' issues, but also takes in everything from bin collections and churchyards to fly tipping and stray dogs, (and a great deal more).

After an intense first few weeks of getting to grips with the dual roles, my workload is finally beginning to settle into a routine and I'm looking forward to the coming years. I've found the culture at Swale Borough Council to be significantly more open and accessible than it is at Kent County Council. Senior officers are far easier to contact and more forthcoming with responses to questions and enquiries.

In the interest of balance, I should mention that there are a number of factors which may have contributed to this difference in culture. When I started at KCC in May 2021, we were only just coming out of the last Covid lockdown, masks were still commonplace and the induction day at County Hall still involved a fair amount of social distancing. The first two KCC

full council meetings of the new council took place at Mote Park sports centre because the council chamber at County Hall was too small to allow councillors and staff to remain safely distanced from each other.

In addition to this, in May 2021 I was entirely new to politics. I think it's safe to say I've learned more over the past two years than at any point since my mid-teens, and although I still have plenty to learn, I now know how best to get the information I need to carry out my role effectively. I have some big plans for the coming years. The biggest challenge will be finding ways to carry them out whilst working with the exceptionally tight budgets we have available

# Faversham Household Waste Recycling Centre (Tip)

Kent County Council will be launching a consultation in mid-July to look at options relating to the Household Waste Recycling Centres across the county. Unfortunately for Faversham and Swale East, the Faversham site is currently lined up for closure in all of the very limited set of 'options' they have proposed.

My colleague Mark Hood is on a working group at KCC which has been tasked with writing the consultation document. There is cross party consensus that a significant volume of additional information needs to be made public for the consultation to be meaningful. The cabinet member for Environment at KCC has said that she would be open to alternative suggestions, but the lack of information given currently means any alternatives put forward would be largely based on guesswork.

# St James the Great, following Him

Jesus, fresh from His baptism and fired with His new calling, bursts into Galilee. Coming upon four fishermen working on the shore of the lake, He says to them, 'Follow Me'.

Without further ado or even a second thought, they abandon what they're doing (and in the case of two of them, James and John, leave their poor old father alone in the boat with the hired crew), and set off with Jesus, they know not where. That is how Mark's Gospel records the recruitment of four of the apostles of Jesus. Talk about a sudden change of life!

All our understanding of human behaviour tells us that this is not how people normally respond to such a peremptory invitation: no questions, no explanation. Take it or leave it. Just 'Follow me'.

That however is on a superficial reading of the text. In fact, because we have four Gospels rather than just three, we know from John that one pair of brothers, James and John, and the other two called on the same day, had been disciples of John the Baptist, who had pointed Jesus out to them as the 'Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world'.

Subsequently two of them had sought Him out and spent some time with Him in the Jordan area. This was not quite the instant 'conversion' described by Matthew and Mark, though undoubtedly it evoked an instant response.

For many of us on the journey of faith the experience of James and John - and the other two, Peter and Andrew - mirrors our own experience. First, we know about Jesus, perhaps as children at Sunday school, or later as adults. Then we begin to ask questions and look for answers. Finally, there may come a time when we hear His voice, as it were, calling us to accompany Him on a life of love, service and commitment.

For James (whose feast day falls on 25th July) this moment was to turn his whole life upside down. He became a leader of the church in Jerusalem after the resurrection and was the first apostle to be martyred. being put to the sword by Herod Agrippa in 44AD. His brother John, in contrast, lived on as a senior figure in the life of the emerging Church.

For all four who were called by the lake that day, nothing would ever be quite the same again. But then all those who set out to follow Jesus wherever He leads them are usually in for a few surprises.

# Diabetes timebomb: NHS to offer 'soup and shakes' diet


The NHS is to roll out a 'soup and shakes' diet across the UK, aimed at the tens of thousands of patients who are fighting Type 2 diabetes.

Health officials said every part of the country will be offering the regime by next March, as the NHS tries to tackle what has been called Britain's 'diabetes timebomb'.

Pilot schemes report an average of two stone in weight loss in three months.

Clinical trials seem to show that this will be enough to reverse about half of diabetes cases. The 'soups and shakes' diet is a 'total diet replacement' product, which aims to deliver 800 to 900 calories a day for 12 weeks.

Professor Jonathan Valabhji, the NHS England's national clinical director for diabetes and obesity, says: "Research is clear that weight loss, where indicated, goes a long way to helping people stay well and avoiding preventable illness, and in many cases, it can be the trigger for putting Type 2 diabetes into remission.

#### The sweet smell of rain

Have you ever noticed the sweet, fresh smell after a downpour of rain? That 'smell of rain' is called petrichor, and it fascinates scientists.

It was back in 1965 that scientists first named it. Petrichor comes from the Greek for stone, 'petra', and the golden fluid flowing through the veins of the immortals, 'ichor'.

Petrichor is produced when raindrops form air pockets on the rocks and soil, and softly force the release of aromatic chemicals trapped there. The petrichor-scented compounds drift upwards into the atmosphere as a gas, like a glass of champagne.

The odour itself comes mainly from a chemical called geosmin, which is made by bacteria in soil. Geosmin is made by soil microbes, to fend off hungry worms. Geosmin is highly pungent, and even just five parts per trillion can be picked up by the human nose.
