## From the Editor.

The cover photo comes from [www.thediamondjubilee.org](http://www.thediamondjubilee.org), which has a great deal of Jubilee information. Here are a few snippets which may interest you.

## The Queen and the Church of England

The Sovereign holds the title 'Defender of the Faith and Supreme Governor of the Church of England'.

There are many examples of the relationship between the established Church and the State.

Archbishops and bishops are appointed by The Queen on the advice of the Prime Minister, who considers the names selected by a Church Commission. They take an oath of allegiance to The Queen on appointment and may not resign without Royal authority.

The connection between Church and State is also symbolised by the fact that the 'Lords Spiritual' (consisting of the Archbishops of Canterbury and York and 24 diocesan bishops) sit in the House of Lords. Parish priests also take an oath of allegiance to The Queen.

The General Synod (including the bishops, elected representatives from the clergy and the laity) is the supreme authority of the Church of England. The Queen opens the Synod after the elections in the dioceses every five years.

## The cover photograph, a description of The Queen's dress and The Duke of Edinburgh's uniform

The Queen is wearing a State Dress of white silk, satin and lace with silver coloured sequins. The dress has a flowing scalloped edge, and was created in Buckingham Palace by Miss Angela Kelly.

### Jewellery

The Queen is wearing the State Diadem, a circlet of diamonds, created in 1820. The Queen wears this during the procession to and from the State Opening of Parliament, and wore it on her Coronation Day, for the procession to Westminster Abbey.

The Queen is also wearing Queen Victoria's Collet Necklace which has been

worn by five generations of Royal Ladies (Queen Victoria, Queen Alexandra, Queen Mary, Queen Elizabeth (the Queen Mother) and the present Queen). Queen Victoria (The Queen's great-great grandmother) wore this necklace for her own official Diamond Jubilee photograph (issued in 1897).

On the blue Garter Riband (or sash) The Queen is wearing the Royal Family Orders of her grand father, King George V, and father, King George VI. The Queen is wearing the Garter Star.

**The Duke of Edinburgh**  
The Duke of Edinburgh is wearing Royal Navy ceremonial day dress (Admiral of the Fleet) with Garter Sash.

## National Service of Thanksgiving, St Paul's Cathedral, 10.30am on Tuesday 5th June

The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh will be depart from Buckingham Palace at 10.15am by car. They will travel to St Paul's Cathedral via the Mall, Trafalgar Square, the Strand, Fleet Street, and Ludgate Hill to St Paul's Cathedral.

Her Majesty, His Royal Highness, and many Members of The Royal Family, will attend the National Service of Thanksgiving to Celebrate Her Majesty's Diamond Jubilee at St Paul's Cathedral to which 2,000 people have been invited.

The following Prayer, written at The Queen's direction by the Chapter of St Paul's Cathedral for Her Majesty's Diamond Jubilee, will be used in the Jubilee Thanksgiving Service. The Archbishops of Canterbury and York have commended it for use throughout the Church of England. Other churches are also welcome to use the prayer.

*God of time and eternity,  
whose Son reigns as servant, not master;  
we give you thanks and praise  
that you have blessed this Nation, the  
Realms and Territories  
with ELIZABETH,  
our beloved and glorious Queen.  
In this year of Jubilee,  
grant her your gifts of love and joy  
and peace  
as she continues in faithful obedience  
to you, her Lord and God  
and in devoted service to her lands  
and peoples,  
and those of the Commonwealth,  
now and all the days of her life;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord.  
Amen.*



## Diamonds: A Jubilee Celebration

The Summer Opening of Buckingham Palace, 30th June – 8th July and 31st July – 7th October

Diamond, the hardest natural material known, carries associations of endurance and longevity. These qualities, allied to the purity, magnificence and value of the stones, have for centuries led rulers to deploy diamonds in regalia, jewellery and precious objects. Individual diamonds have achieved great renown, passing down the generations and between enemies or allies as potent symbols of sovereignty and as precious gifts. A spectacular exhibition at Buckingham Palace will show the many ways in which diamonds have been used by British monarchs over the last 200 years. The exhibition includes an unprecedented display of a number of The Queen's personal jewels – those inherited by Her Majesty or acquired during her reign. The exhibition will reveal how many of these extraordinary stones have undergone a number of transformations, having been re-cut or incorporated into new settings during their fascinating history. ### What puts the 'fizz' in teenagers

*Here's a slightly frightening thought: it seems that drinking five fizzy drinks a week makes teenagers more likely to act violently, and even to carry a weapon. Even two fizzy drinks a week can make teenagers more aggressive. As for those teens who drink 14 cans a week – they are twice as likely to behave violently towards friends, partners and siblings.*

*The research, at the University of Vermont, reported: "When we broke it down, we found that incidences of violence were going up with every extra can of soft drink. We don't know what is the reason behind it. It is hard to say it is sugar; because sugar is available in a lot of other things as well. There are other ingredients in soft drinks that could be a factor as well." The study was published in the journal Injury Prevention.*

The Annual Parish Council Meeting was held on Thursday 26th April 2012. The Chairman gave his report: The Parish Council meets bi-monthly with 5 Councillors. A relatively quiet year with regard to planning applications mainly due to restrictions as Eastling is in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. The village sign was erected in May 2011 with the whole cost funded by grants. The council has been dealing with village road problems, requesting action from KCC Highways. There is still no 30mph speed limit through the village but efforts continue to try to achieve a satisfactory result. The Website [Eastling.co](http://Eastling.co) has been running for a year and it is hoped that it is useful to both villagers and visitors. The treasurer circulated his report showing the income and expenditure for the year 2011/2012. The chairman thanked the attendees and the meeting concluded at 8.45pm.

## Nature in the Garden

The cuckoo that once almost drove us to distraction with his repetitive call is now heard only for a short while in April. His visits, so long awaited, are fleeting and soon just a memory. But the wood where the cuckoo would rest fascinates me. I often look at the mass of trees and undergrowth and wonder what goes on in there at night. The wood at night always seems a mystery. It is easy to pick out the sound of the tawny owl, the vixen's scream or the badger's grunt, and frogs that croak throatily, like swamp creatures, bringing tropical sounds into an English living room. But the night woods look eerie, cold dark and foreboding. Yet by day in spring the buzzards fly over the valley looking for food and the ladybird that hid in the



window recess has awoken and waits to rid the roses of aphid. Pheasants choose to live here in the garden but they take a risk as foxes prowl. The orchard, where once hens and guinea fowl scurried through the seedy grass, is now home to chatty sparrows, mice and bees. Migrant butterflies crowd the busy garden and, with the sun on their wings, illustrate still further the beauty of this summer's day.
