#### From the Editor.

The cover photo comes from www.thediamondjubilee.org, which has a great deal of Jubilee information. Here are a few snippets which may interest you.

## The Queen and the Church of England

The Sovereign holds the title 'Defender of the Faith and Supreme Governor of the Church of England'.

There are many examples of the relationship between the established Church and the State.

Archbishops and bishops are appointed by The Queen on the advice of the Prime Minister, who considers the names selected by a Church Commission. They take an oath of allegiance to The Queen on appointment and may not resign without Royal authority.

The connection between Church and State is also symbolised by the fact that the 'Lords Spiritual' (consisting of the Archbishops of Canterbury and York and 24 diocesan bishops) sit in the House of Lords. Parish priests also take an oath of allegiance to The Queen.

The General Synod (including the bishops, elected representatives from the clergy and the laity) is the supreme authority of the Church of England. The Queen opens the Synod after the elections in the dioceses every five years.

The Archbishops of Canterbury and York have commended it for use throughout the Church of England. Other churches are also welcome to use the prayer.

# What puts the 'fizz' in teenagers

Here's a slightly frightening thought: it seems that drinking five fizzy drinks a week makes teenagers more likely to act violently, and even to carry a weapon. Even two fizzy drinks a week can make teenagers more aggressive. As for those teens who drink 14 cans a week - they are twice as likely to behave violently towards friends, partners and siblings.

The research, at the University of Vermont, reported: "When we broke it down, we found that incidences of violence were going up with every extra can of soft drink. We don't know what is the reason behind it. It is hard to say it is sugar, because sugar is available in a lot of other things as well. There are other ingredients in soft drinks that could be a factor as well." The study was published in the journal Injury Prevention.

The Annual Parish Council Meeting was held on Thursday 26th April 2012. The Chairman gave his report: The Parish Council meets bi-monthly with 5 Councillors. A relatively quiet year with regard to planning applications mainly due to restrictions as Eastling is in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. The village sign was erected in May 2011 with the whole cost funded by grants. The council has been dealing with village road problems,

requesting action from KCC Highways. There is still no 30mph speed limit through the village but efforts continue to try to achieve a satisfactory result. The Website Eastling.co has been running for a year and it is hoped that it is useful to both villagers and visitors. The treasurer circulated his report showing the income and expenditure for the year 2011/2012. The chairman thanked the attendees and the meeting concluded at 8.45pm.

## Nature in the Garden

The cuckoo that once almost drove us to distraction with his repetitive call is now heard only for a short while in April. His visits, so long awaited, are fleeting and soon just a memory. But the wood where the cuckoo would rest fascinates me. I often look at the mass of trees and undergrowth and wonder what



goes on in there at night. The wood at night always seems a mystery. It is easy to pick out the sound of the tawny owl, the vixen's scream or the badger's grunt, and frogs that croak throatily, like swamp creatures, bringing tropical sounds into an English living room. But the night woods look eerie, cold dark and foreboding. Yet by day in spring the buzzards fly over the valley looking for food and the ladybird that hid in the

window recess has awoken and waits to rid the roses of aphid. Pheasants choose to live here in the garden but they take a risk as foxes prowl. The orchard, where once hens and guinea fowl scurried through the seedy grass, is now home to chatty sparrows, mice and bees. Migrant butterflies crowd the busy garden and, with the sun on their wings, illustrate still further the beauty of this summer's day.





