Dr Ruth M. Bancewicz, who is Church Engagement Director at The Faraday Institute for Science and Religion in Cambridge, writes on the positive relationship between Science and Christian faith.

It's difficult as a scientist to hear information that is fascinating, but which also involves so much suffering for other people. I worked for a time in a leukaemia research lab. We had to let other people's pain drive our research without it crippling our ability to concentrate on our work. But, writing this under lockdown, I have found myself - as a biologically-educated bystander avoiding looking into the science of COVID-19 because the reminders of its impact on people's lives are everywhere that I look.



A Scientist Reflects on God's Heart for the Suffering

One of the ways I have been managing my own feelings during the pandemic is by digging deeper into what God has revealed to us about His character, letting that fuel my faith, my prayers, and my actions. For more academic types like myself, study – particularly of the Bible – can be one of the primary ways we connect with God and hear from Him. It's not wrong to be comforted by books, so long as the contents turn our eyes upwards and outwards.

First of all, God hears: "The Lord is close to the broken-hearted' (Psalm 34:18a). In Jesus God took on human

form, and He showed us His heart for the world. When His friend Lazarus died, He wept (John 11). God is "the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort" (2 Corinthians 1:3).

Human sin has affected the whole of creation, and I believe this is largely the direct impact of our mismanagement of creation and mistreatment of each other. COVID-19 may well be another animal's friendly

virus, pushed by human activity into causing havoc in bodies where it doesn't belong.

But God's world remains good. It is still fruitful, praising Him, as Psalm 19 describes. Even pictures of a deadly virus can seem beautiful – especially to a biologist! These good things are hints of the promised "new heavens and new earth" mentioned in the New Testament. One day "creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay" (Romans 8: 21), and for everyone who follows God, "He will wipe every tear from their eyes" (Revelation 21: 4).

Behind the debates about suffering is sometimes the assumption that God doesn't care. My experience is that God does care deeply, and He invites His Church to care for those around them – especially the most vulnerable. He is with us, He hears us and grieves with us, He helps us and promises a better future.

Surely time will never sour The loveliness seen with each hour


That passes here,

material for a history of Throwley for 43 years. With more time here at home, as a result of 'Lockdown', I am pulling together the ideas and starting to write it all up. This will compliment my History of Throwley Church.

The story is intriguing.

The earliest settlers were drawn along the stream from Ospringe up into the inhospitable wooded valleys where they fanned out to put down roots and make a living from the cleared woodland. Institutions like manors, church and the village evolved, landowners and farmsteads grew, and a society developed. All these were constantly changing, then as now, as people moved in and out for the economy was never static.

Sources on information are legion

The fields and boundaries; the place names; the buildings; photographs; and pictures are to name but a few indicators of history and change.

However, knowingly or unknowingly everyone has little pieces of evidence of our past which, when put

ANECDOTES FROM THE THROWLEY ARCHIVES

War from the Air

Between 1940 and 1944 508 high explosive bombs, 2000 incendiary bombs, 10 oil bombs, 10 parachute mines and 20 V1s fell in the villages around Faversham. Nine enemy planes crash landed. Throwley suffered a range of near misses.

In August 1940 an incendiary bomb fell at Tong Green. In September a British fighter plane came down near Workhouse Cottage.

In July 1944 Throwley was the most bombed village in the Eastern Parishes of Swale Rural District. On 3rd July a flying bomb exploded in the air after being hit by machine gun fire from a fighter and fell in pieces at Tong Green. Another crashed in a field at Broomfield on the evening of 8th August and damaged farm buildings and cottages. On 16th August one house was damaged when a bomb fell on Snoad Street. On 17th August another bomb was shot down and damaged cottages at Belmont. Throwley residents were indeed in the line of fire.

everyone's help the accumulation and interpretation of these will provide a better understanding of what did happen over the centuries and why.

So I have the first three questions to start with please:

- 1. Where are/were the water springs and pools in Throwley?
- 2. Which houses have/had wells, and/or underground storages, and how deep are they?
- 3. Who has any pre 1950 property deeds or plans/maps or documents for Throwley houses and land?

I hope that sharing this will encourage us all to feel part of a project to understand why our village is as it is and to answer all the questions never answered before.

Eastling School News



They'd need as they grew old.


But history books will talk of them,





The Occupational therapy team has developed great resources that you can download to support your mental health and wellbeing during the pandemic.

Why not use a journal? Some people find it easier to write down their thoughts and feelings instead of talking to friends and family. At a time when phone calls and video chats are the only way of communicating with the majority of our address book, having a creative outlet to think about how isolation is affecting you and your mental wellbeing could be a really handy tool.

There is also have a self isolation booklet, which is full of handy tips and advice on ways you can protect you mental health during isolation. You can find a checklist from MIND and lots of contact details for organisations that are working to support people during the pandemic.

And finally, a special recovery pack provides a space for you to think about ways in which you can manage your anxiety during isolation. There are lots of exercises and advice for ways to keep your mind healthy. You'll find information about apps to download and exercise regimes to try and prevent stress building.


