June Message

As I write, the country is gearing up for the extended bank holiday weekend and the celebrations to mark the Queen's Platinum jubilee. With picnics and street parties planned, I'm hopeful that the weather is in a celebratory mood too! Whatever your views on the monarchy, I think it would be hard not to agree that the Queen has led an extraordinary life. In a speech made on her 21st birthday, the Queen said 'I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service.' This immense sense of vocation has surely given meaning, purpose and perseverance to her long life.

It's not a life that I envy, but I am inspired by the service and devotion that the Queen has shown. For her, there is no demarcation between life and work and I imagine she would easily be able to answer some of life's basic questions such as 'What am I doing and why am I doing it?'

This sense of vocation is something that we are in danger of losing in the Western world where jobs and careers change many times over a lifetime. We work for money rather than for the value of the work itself. We work so that we can stop working and do something else as soon as possible because so many of the jobs that we have do not seem to have any connection to the

improvement of the world. Very often we do not see the fruits of our labours or get to know our own creative potential.

When we are able to look at our gifts, our talents, our circumstances, our uniqueness and offer them in service for the love of others and the love of our planet, we will sense a vocation which fires, inspires and commits us. Jesus Christ modelled this kind of life for us. The poet Gibran said, 'work is love made visible'.

This sense of vocation can sustain a lifetime and continue to find its outlet when the process of ageing takes its toll and we cannot accomplish tasks as we once did. We will still find meaning and purpose as our faculties fall away. This spirituality of work is based on the idea that everything is sacred, holy and will continue after we are gone. Reverend Reuben Smith wrote 'Let the old men plant trees, though they may never expect to eat the fruit of them'.

I hope that you enjoy the celebrations for the Queen's Platinum jubilee and in the words of ex-Archbishop John Sentamu: 'Inspired by Her Majesty, let us strive to leave the world a better, holier, joyful, friendlier place than it was when we were born'



Help, my kids just asked me a science question!

Why aren't dinosaurs in the Bible?

The Bible wasn't written to list all the animals on earth or tell us about science. It was written a long time before people started to use science to learn about the world. When the Bible was written, people didn't even have a word for

dinosaurs yet! But it's not just dinosaurs that aren't mentioned in the Bible, it doesn't talk about armadillos, kangaroos, sabre-toothed cats or penguins either! That doesn't mean that the Bible is out of date or wrong, or that these animals aren't important. Rather than teaching us science, many Christians believe that the Bible was written to tell people about God, how much He loves them, and all the amazing things He has done.

The Bible says that God made everything, and loves everything He made, so that includes dinosaurs. It also encourages people to explore and find out all about the wonderful things it says God has made. Science is a part of this exploration.

Did God make the dinosaurs?

The Bible (the holy book that Christians read) says that God made everything. All the stars, the Earth and all the amazing plants and animals that have ever lived here. So yes, most Christians believe that God made the dinosaurs!

The Bible also teaches that God loves it when people explore His creation, and

science is a great way of doing that. So, for many Christians, science is one of the fun things we can use to learn all about how God made everything, including all of the dinosaurs!

Were humans and dinosaurs ever living on earth at the same time?

Yes! But probably not the kind of dinosaur you're thinking of! Most of the dinosaurs died out a very, very long time ago, way before humans first lived. But some of the smaller, feathery dinosaurs survived and over a long time they have evolved into the animals we call birds.

So, from chickens and robins to penguins and ostriches, there are dinosaurs living all over our world today!



This lecture serves as an introduction to the art of South Africa whilst addressing important contemporary themes relating to the depiction of race, colonialism and the appropriation of African culture.



THE GOLDEN AGE OF SONG: JEROME KERN -THE 'DADDY' OF THEM ALL Lecturer: Pip Burley

Kern was born of middle-class parents in New York in 1885 and, in a career spanning more than four decades, composed more than 700 songs used in over 100 stage works, musicals and films. He was one of the great innovators of American popular song and the 'father' of a whole family of song writers who would follow him. Songs featured include: "A Fine Romance", "The Folks Who Live on the Hill", "I Won't Dance", "Long Ago and Far Away", " All the Things You Are", "The Way You Look Tonight", "They Didn't Believe Me"

Pip Burley began his musical career playing Rock'n'Roll in the 60s and 70s as well as working with the big bands - including Sydney Lipton, Joe Loss and Ken Mackintosh. He went on to compose and record music for commercials, theatre, film and television and, in 1990, won an Ivor Novello Award for Best Television Theme music for The Darling Buds of May - a TV series he also produced (discovering Catherine Zeta-Jones in the process). Other television successes include the multi-award winning series A Touch of Frost. As a sideline he also managed to start and run an advertising agency!

The new marriage laws

Marriage should be honoured by all. Hebrews 13:4

A new Act of Parliament has introduced no fault divorce to England and Wales. Now one or both parties to a marriage can get a divorce without the need to blame the other person.

It was introduced because there were a very small number of marriages where one person could stop the other getting a divorce, even though the relationship was at an end. A man or woman had to show that the marriage had irretrievably broken down, as demonstrated by the other's adultery, behaviour or they lived apart for a period of at least two years. But making such an accusation of desertion, behaving badly or having a sexual relationship outside marriage would often stoke up bitterness, and make it difficult to agree on important issues about children or money.


Some people have argued that no fault divorce makes marriage less important or removes personal responsibility. Sadly, the numbers of people getting married are falling and the divorce rate is increasing. Fewer choose to marry in church.

Divorce used to the privilege of rich people, and even then was granted only for a few reasons. In the 19th

century it was easier legally for a man to get a divorce than for a woman to get one. In the 1970s a new paper-based procedure came in, whereby parties did not have to physically go to court hearing a divorce. Now divorces are done online on a government website.

The new Divorce, Dissolution and Separation Act 2020 removes blame, but still ensures there is a minimum period of 20 weeks between the start of proceedings and when individuals may apply for a conditional order of divorce. This allows a time to reflect and discuss problems, and where reconciliation is not possible, to agree important questions such as those involving children, finance and property.

Christians will have a different understanding of marriage, and to many people divorce will always be a painful and stressful process, regardless of the law. As always this is a very simple comment on a complex subject. Always get professional advice before taking any steps. There are local and national organisations which offer guidance on reconciliation (getting back together) and mediation (staying apart but sorting out important issues).

Ukrainian church leaders urge people to pray

A senior church leader in Ukraine has told the citizens that Russia's war on Ukraine "did not begin with missiles and bombs – it began with deception, untruth and lies." So says the head of Ukraine's independent Orthodox Church, Metropolitan Epiphany (Dumenko).

"The Lord is now showing us how we must resist with the testimony of truth. Evil is evil, not just an alternative viewpoint, and war is war, not just some conflict. Rapists, looters and murderers are criminals, and what they are perpetuating is a genocide of the Ukrainian people."

The Metropolitan also said that Ukrainians knew that Russia had long had "evil plans to restore the tyranny of a rotten, overthrown empire."

But, he said "The Lord is with us in this struggle, because we are fighting for truth and goodness against demonic tyranny and resentment.... We believe that our people will overcome all new challenges – that Ukraine will win its victory." Meanwhile, the Primate of Ukraine's Greek Catholic Church, Major Archbishop Sviatoslav Shevchuk of Kyiv-Halych, said that this Spring and Summer may well be the last for many, including himself.

He went on: "As the war escalates, and the enemy intensifies its offensive against Ukraine, I call on everyone to pray vigorously and tirelessly for the Ukrainian army, because the fate of Ukraine and the world is now being decided."
