

# Message from our new Rector



Hello everyone, I'm Rev. Paula and I greet you as your new Rector of the parishes of the combined benefice of Kingsdown and Creekside and High Downs. I was newly instituted by Bishop Rose and installed by Archdeacon Andrew on the 2<sup>nd</sup> May in an incredibly wonderful and well attended service held at Lynsted church.

I have, up to now, been the Assistant Curate of your neighbouring seven church benefice of Tunstall and Bredgar. I have a passion for rural ministry and mission and have also recently been appointed as the Bishop's adviser for Rural Ministry within the Canterbury Diocese

The churches in our parishes have always had good links with their wider communities, both with its groups and with village events and I would very much hope to be able to carry that on, as well as enable others to do the same.

Community is so important in a world in which selfcentredness seems to dominate, and where there is the notion of 'ME' rather than 'US'. But there are pockets of people who are working together for the good of everyone. Those working and supporting our foodbanks, those who care for others or carry out jobs for those less able to do them. There are people who give to charity, whether by monetary donation or the donation of preloved items that they may no longer need. Then there are those whose random acts of kindness surprise us, move us and inspire us to do the same.

Moving away from the 'ME' to the 'US' takes courage and requires us to see the good in the people who we


would otherwise avoid and when we do this, we are changed as a result. Canterbury Diocese has the strap line of 'Changed lives - changing lives'. This means that when our own lives are changed, we go on to change the lives of others. As a Christian community, we follow the lead of Jesus. He transformed the lives of the disciples and they in turn transformed the people who they met. With this long line of historic transformation we are but the next to inherit the gift of faith in Jesus and we are challenged to transform the lives of others in the same way as we have been transformed in Christ.

As I begin my ministry here, I hope to spend some time alongside the various communities that I serve and look forward to getting to know you all.

A great opportunity for this will be at the various events in our villages, such as the Throwley Fete and the Stalisfield street party both on the 1st of June. We are so blessed to live where there is such vibrance!

### John the Baptist, preparing the way for the Messiah

John the Baptist is famous for baptising Jesus, and for losing his head to a woman. He was born to Zechariah, a Temple priest, and Elizabeth, who was a cousin of Mary, the mother of Jesus. John was born when his mother was advanced in years, and after the foretelling of his birth and the choice of his name by an angel, we hear nothing more of him until he began his mission of preaching and baptising in the river Jordan c27.

John was a lot like an Old Testament prophet: he lived simply on locusts and honey in the wilderness, and his message was one of repentance and preparation for the coming of the Messiah and His Kingdom. He went on to baptise Jesus, at Jesus' firm request. When John went on to denounce the incestuous union of Herod Antipas with his niece and brother's wife, Herodias, he was imprisoned and eventually beheaded at the demand of Salome, Herodias' daughter.



# **Transforming Lives Together**

By The Rev'd Dr Jonathan Arnold, Executive Director of The Social Justice Network.

It was very good to come to Eastling to preside and preach at the Sunday Eucharist on April 7th. Chatting afterwards I got talking about my role directing the Social Justice Network and was invited to write more about it here

The Social Justice Network is a charity that brings people together to share best practice and build capacity. Issues of low income, debt, lack of skills, poor mental health and isolation are complex and closely interlinking, trapping communities and individuals in a web of poverty.

Our vision is to see all churches, in every community, coming together to tackle these issues through action, prayer and giving. The Social Justice Network works closely with the Communities and Partnerships team at Canterbury Diocese to provide support to churches in Kent.

We aim to deliver work through innovative partnerships with other charities, voluntary organisations, and local authorities. We aim to improve access to resources, make local work more effective, and create a framework for others to respond to the social challenges in Kent.

We engage with churches of all denominations, as well as faith-based organisations, to encourage them to work together and with others in responding to poverty and marginalisation. We offer practical advice and guidance to parishes considering how they can better serve the socially and financially deprived in their communities.

Our diocese expresses our faith in God through work in high profile topical issue areas such as community engagement, social and environmental justice. We work closely with and develop relationships with partner networks to discern and develop new audiences for future engagement.

The team has a range of expertise, as well as being linked into a wider network of diverse, knowledgeable, and passionate people. We aim to be a resource for deaneries, parishes, and the general community to help them fulfil their mission to work towards a sustainable and flourishing future. To this end we will increasingly shape our work in response to diocesan and Church of England priorities and in partnership with other agencies.'

#### **OUR PROJECTS AND PARTNERSHIPS**

#### **BREAK THE CYCLE**

Break the Cycle aims to end the cycle of re-offending caused by releasing people from prison into street

homelessness, by means of a partnership project to provide supported housing and community

support and to evaluate the effect this support has on re-offending rates. This project is led by The Social Justice Network, in partnership with the Diocese of Canterbury, CampaignKent, and others. A diocesan property has been made available to the project. A key element of this project is integrating house residents into the local community to build their self-confidence and improve their mental health and well-being.

# WORKING WITH REFUGEES AND ASYLUM SEEKERS IN KENT



We work with refugees and asylum seekers within the Canterbury Diocese. This role is tasked with identifying the current and future needs of this vulnerable group of people

in order to guide where our diocese can most usefully provide support. This work is carried out through the important partnerships with other organisations such as KRAN.

# REFUGEE, ASYLUM SEEKERS SUPPORT IN CALAIS



As joint partners in the Refugee Project in the Northern France Coastal region, The Social Justice Network seeks to respond to the growing needs of numbers of migrants, refugees and asylum seekers

in the area. The Diocese in Europe, the Diocese of Canterbury and USPG have shared their resources and experience to facilitate an innovative approach to ministry in this challenging context. The role is focussed on front-line working with people seeking asylum, and connects partnerships with stakeholder organisations, the Kent Refugee Programmes Manager, and other key contacts in the Diocese in Europe to deepen wider work with refugees

#### **CONNECTING CANTERBURY**

Connecting Canterbury is a network of community hubs located across the City of Canterbury, offering information and signposting alongside access to safe and responsible saving and borrowing through Kent Savers Credit Union products. In times of lockdown and social distancing we have continued to serve people by phone, text and online. With many people and families struggling to survive debt and the inability to provide for basic needs, thanks to the support of Christians we are willing to consider making small emergency grants for heating and transport etc. For larger needs such as white goods, we apply to charities and trusts such as Acts 435. We work alongside organisations such as Canterbury Food



Bank, the Salvation Army, Catching Lives, Social Workers, the City Council and Citizen's Advice. We are members of Christians/Churches Together in Canterbury, but our support is open to everyone, of faith or no faith.
