





Dear Friends


I start my letter that way as I hope it is what we will become!

Charity collections: From Trading Standards on behalf of the registered charity 'Sense' who operate shops in East Kent. 'Sense' have advised Trading Standards that envelopes containing a bag that are of a very similar design to theirs are being distributed to households in the Canterbury and Ashford areas. The 'Sense' envelope invites householders to fill the printed bag enclosed with goods for their charity. The envelope clearly bears the name of the charity 'Sense'. Trading Standards are advising householders to check any envelope purporting to be from a charity very carefully, as envelopes of a very similar design are being distributed by another company. These similar envelopes do not bear the charity name 'Sense' but state the name of another company instead. The similar envelopes contain plain bags for householders to use.

Please note the new telephone number for NHW liaison officer (see above) Unsolicited services: Please be aware of unscrupulous individuals offering "services" at your front door - building work, garden maintenance, driveways etc. You should never agree to have work done by someone who is just passing, or take their word for it that work needs to be done at all. 




