### **Reflected Faith:**

### **Hiding, waiting, hoping – FREE!**

After many long months during the Covid pandemic we are at last beginning to be able to come together again. Some countries and some areas of some countries will be more open than others and we can only hope, pray and wait for all of us to be able to be 'free' again.

May, in the Church's calendar, is supremely the month of freedom.

During the first few weeks we continue to celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus and reflect on the Bible stories of those who met Him after His crucifixion and resurrection.

Then we celebrate His Ascension – Jesus' return to His Father.

### Nectar in your garden

In towns and cities our home gardens are now the largest source of food for insects such as bees and wasps.



They yield 85 per cent of the nectar produced in urban areas, according to a study published in the Journal of Ecology. Three such gardens will generate about a teaspoon a day of the sugar-rich liquid which is found in the flowers that the pollinators drink for energy. A teaspoon of nectar is the equivalent of more than a ton of food for an adult human, and it is enough to fuel thousands of flying bees.

One ecologist has called home gardens "pivotal" in promoting biodiversity in urban areas across the county. Gardens are thought to cover 29 per cent of the land in urban areas, which is six times the area of parks and 40 times that of allotments.

The research was carried out in partnership with the universities of Edinburgh and Reading and the Royal Horticultural Society.

The school has just replaced the wooden play equipment on the school playground and the children are thrilled that this has been installed for them.



# DATE FOR YOUR DIARY North Downs' sponsored Walk

### **Sunday 8th August**

The North Downs Walk in and around Harrietsham has been an annual event for the past 35 years, until last year when we had to cancel for the first time ever. However, we are determined to put on the event this year. It will be a somewhat different format BUT

- \*There will still be the choice of 4 routes 1,3 6 and 9 miles, all starting and finishing at Glebe Field, Harrietsham (opposite the church), and taking in the beautiful North Downs.
- \*It will be fully marshalled and signposted with regular checkpoints for you and your dogs to take on refreshments.
- \*You will still be able to retain 50% of your sponsorship for your own cause or charity.

However due to various restrictions one or two things have had to change;

- \*We cannot hire Harrietsham Village Hall as it is being used for Covid vaccinations so we are intending using the field opposite the church as the start and finish point using gazebos for registration.
- \*A knock-on effect is that we cannot provide food this year.
- \*We will also be asking you to bring a drinking vessel to fill up at the various checkpoints to save multi-handling of cups with the commensurate risk of spreading Covid.

We do hope these inconveniences will not put you off and are hoping for a good turnout after almost 18 months without any real events. We are still finalising the detail but intend to start accepting registrations by Mid May. 
I guess we all know that feeling. Sometimes life is hard, and we know we have a need for courage, but somehow, we just don't want to be brave. We would rather give in, surrender to the difficulties, and wallow in self-pity.

The Bible seems to constantly exhort us to be brave, to be strong, to take heart, to be courageous. And life during a pandemic certainly calls for us to make a courageous response. But occasionally we may feel overwhelmed and ready to give in or give up.

### 23<sup>rd</sup> May: Day of Pentecost, Whit Sunday

Pentecost took place on the well-established Jewish festival of Firstfruits, which was observed at the beginning of the wheat harvest. It was seven weeks after Easter, or 50 days including Easter.

A feast day to celebrate the country's wheat harvest does not sound exactly world-changing, but that year, it became one of the most important days in world history. For Pentecost was the day that Jesus sent the Holy Spirit - the day the Church was born.

Jesus had told His disciples that something big was going to happen, and that they were to wait for it in Jerusalem, instead of returning to Galilee. Jesus had plans for His disciples, but He knew they could not do the work themselves. They would need His help.

They would need His help. And so, they waited in Jerusalem, praying together with His other followers, for many days. And then on that fateful morning there was suddenly the sound as of a mighty rushing wind. Tongues of flame flickered on their heads, and they began to praise God in many tongues, to the astonishment of those who heard them. The curse of Babel (Genesis 11: 1-9) was dramatically reversed that morning.

That morning the Holy Spirit came to indwell the disciples and followers of Jesus. The Church was born. The Christians were suddenly full of life and power, utterly different from their former fearful selves. The change in them was permanent.

Peter gave the first ever sermon of the Christian Church that morning, proclaiming Jesus was the Messiah. His boldness in the face of possible death was in marked contrast to the man who had denied Jesus 50 days before. And 3,000 people responded, were converted, and were baptised. How's that for fast church growth!

Of course, Pentecost was not the first time the Holy Spirit had acted in this world. All through the Old Testament there are accounts of how God's Spirit guided people and strengthened them. But now, because of Christ's death and resurrection. He could INDWELL them. From now on, every Christian could have the confidence that Jesus was with them constantly, through the indwelling of His Holy Spirit.

### Vaccination Equity Campaigns


If you want to give thanks for receiving your vaccination, or to donate to charities who are helping to ensure that every community is supported, the following suggestions are among ways this can be done:
