Message from our Rector

As I write we have just celebrated Holy Week and Easter, itself. Holy Week is that week leading up to Easter which includes Maundy Thursday when Jesus shared what we know as his Last Supper with his disciples as he gave out bread saying, "This is my body given for you" and shared the cup of wine saying, "This is my blood which is shed for you."

We had a special commemoration of the Last Supper in Norton Village Hall with a lamb supper before going out into the Orchard to remember Jesus' betrayal and arrest in the Garden of Gethsemane, swapping a Bramley Apple Orchard for the Olive trees of Gethsamane.

On Good Friday itself, we spent time reflecting on Jesus dying on the Cross with a service of Stations of the Cross accompanied by specially composed piano music by Lissie Bayford. In the afternoon we spent an hour at Newnham Church hearing from the Bible and two people, one a teenager, about the meaning of Jesus dying on the cross.

On the Saturday we were in Eastling remembering that Jesus had been buried and for his followers that was a day when Jesus was absent. Then came Easter Day and our sunrise service at Wychling as we celebrated the risen Jesus and as we saw the sunrise this year amazingly beautiful. What a fabulous sight and what an a wonderful way to celebrate

Easter. ...and this year breakfast was back after a 2 year gap and we certainly enjoyed those bacon butties.

War in Ukraine: Diocese in Europe and USPG launch Ukraine emergency appeal

The Church of England Diocese in Europe and USPG, the mission agency, have launched an emergency appeal to get aid to people in desperate need because of the invasion of Ukraine.

Funds raised by the appeal will support Christian charities and churches carrying out humanitarian work both in Ukraine and responding to the arrival of refugees in neighbouring countries.

Partners on the ground are providing food, medicine, shelter, care for children and people internally displaced in Ukraine. With refugees they are supplying care at the border and beyond, including attention to those from Africa and Asia as well as Ukrainians who are fleeing the war.

The appeal is for urgent help NOW, but the work will go on for many months.

The Church of England's Bishop in Europe, the Rt Revd Robert Innes says: "War is horrible. It injures, destroys, and kills in an often indiscriminate and uncontrollable way. And now, we face war in Europe.

"The people of our little church, Christ Church Kyiv, find themselves in the midst of this crisis. They are typical of so many others.

"Some have fled the city whilst others are still there; praying for their safety and for peace as they shelter as best they can. These people are our brothers and sisters. Those still in Ukraine and those who have fled need our help."

USPG's General Secretary, the Revd Duncan Dormor, adds: "Our hearts and prayers go out to the people of Ukraine. We have launched this appeal in partnership with the Diocese in Europe to stand in solidarity with the people of Ukraine and support church responses to the current crisis."

The Pain of Ukraine *By William Mather*

Ideas for paintings come in all sorts of ways. The awfulness of the Soviet



Aggression in Ukraine has been in all our thoughts and prayers. For me, it was that early image of the block of flats hit by a missile causing death, destruction and a gaping hole. With it came a reminder of Jesus on the cross and a gaping hole in His side from the soldier's spear. The two came together in my mind and so a painting idea was born. With it came thoughts of the great Spanish artist Goya and his powerful etchings 'The Disasters of War' in protest over the French invasion and occupation 1810-1820.

The Christian teaching is that Jesus died on the cross for our sin. None of us is blameless, not least the soldier with the spear or the Russians with the missile. But the poignant promise through the pain - even the pain of Ukraine – is that the message of the cross is more powerful than any tyrant. Through it comes peace in the heart that lasts for ever.

The Arts Society Faversham

Our next lecture is on the 26th May at 11.00am and is given by David Rosier on "Dowager Empress Cixi".

This lecture seeks to provide a balanced insight into the life and achievements of one of the most important women in Chinese Imperial history.

From relative obscurity as a low-ranking consort we explore the events that led to her confirmation as Dowager Empress Cixi in 1861 and her strategy to preserve, then revitalise, imperial rule after a series of humiliating military defeats by Western Colonial Powers plus several brutal ethnic uprisings. We will trace the distinct cycles of Cixi's power, as Emperors came and went, whilst the Dowager Empress moved periodically from a position of influence to full authority and then into times of enforced retirement.

Looking beyond Cixi's desire to force China into the modern world we will gain an insight into her life within her beloved Summer Palace with a focus on her passion for painting, embroidery, fashion design and the extensive gardens. A location where Cixi forged some extraordinarily close relationships with leading western women.

David Rosier is a Chartered Insurer by profession and a Fellow of the Assurance Medical Society, with extensive international experience as an author and lecturer in Medical Risk Assessment. He has in excess of 25 years of working and living in Asia. Whilst living in Hong Kong (1991-2004) he assembled a collection of approximately 700, predominately Qing Dynasty (1644-1911), Imperial and related textiles/costume accessories. Past Committee Member of the Hong Kong Textile Society and frequent speaker on Imperial Insignia and Badges of Rank.

In Salvador Dali's picture of Jesus' ascension all you can see are his feet! As we celebrate the event this month, it prompts the question 'where did Jesus go?' Peter says Jesus 'has gone into heaven and is at God's right hand' (1 Peter 3:22). However, the New Testament tells us three things about what Jesus is doing at the Father's side.

At Pentecost Peter said that Jesus is 'exalted to the right hand of God, He has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear ... "The Lord said to my Lord: 'Sit at my right hand" (Acts 2: 33-4). Peter is affirming Jesus' position of authority and power at the heart of the universe. By pouring out





The Bluebells



Latest Report from KCC Representative - Cllr. Rich Lehmann

Following on from the piece I wrote last month about the Kent County Council Bus Consultation, I have spent a great deal of time over the past few weeks working hard to raise awareness of the threat to rural bus services.

With the help of local volunteers and parish councillors, I posted leaflets to the villages most directly affected by the proposed cuts to let residents know which routes would be affected and how they could have their say. I then held five 'drop-in' sessions in Rodmersham, Conyer, Bredgar, Newnham and Doddington to meet with concerned residents and answer their questions, and also to assist anyone requiring help in completing a consultation response.

It can be very easy to feel daunted when responding to consultation documents. They use official sounding language and questions can sometimes be written or framed in a leading way, leaving it hard to work out how to share what you want to say.

Across the five drop-in sessions I helped a total of 36 residents fill in paper consultation responses. In many cases the respondents were people who for various reasons would not have been able to complete the consultation online. Whilst I'm glad that the views of these residents will be represented, I fear that they are just the tip of the iceberg and that there are likely to be hundreds more across the county who rely on these services but for one reason or another will have missed out on responding.

In addition to ensuring that residents' views on buses are heard, the drop-in sessions were hugely valuable for me in my growth as a councillor. I have been on a steep learning curve since last May's election, and various demanding elements of council work have meant I've not had as much time to spend in our community as I had hoped. Meeting people face to face and listening to their thoughts and concerns helps me to better understand the needs of the dozens of parishes, communities and hamlets that make up Swale East and I will be looking to hold more general drop-in sessions over the coming months. One resident whose views particularly stuck with me was a woman in her 80s who had been getting the same bus for 40 years. She explained to me how she saw the same people on the bus week in, week out, and that the bus passengers were effectively a community too.

Kent County Council have a long list of responsibilities, the first of which is "to seek to improve the lives of all residents in Kent". If they go ahead with cutting these bus services it will be a serious failure of that responsibility.


Another con floating about is an email from Amazon saying your account has been stopped and you should re-enter your bank details. Please delete this mail as it not legitimate.
