



May Message

Spring has sprung and, although at the time of writing we have been experiencing hail storms and chilly temperatures, I am hopeful that by the time you are reading this, it will be more spring like. There is of course new life all around us lambs in the fields, spring flowers, some of which have already had their season but others will be in full bloom.



But the weather (isn't it just British to talk about the weather!) has seemed very unpredictable. I am told that February was one of the driest on record, but then we had March and the first half of April which only seem to have more than made up for it. Temperature wise, just as I thought about leaving a coat behind I had to get my thickest coat off the rack again. And then the sun comes out and disappears again making me doubt whether I have made the right decision with what I am wearing as I go out!

For example on the day I wrote this the sun was shining and warm, so I decided to try eating my lunch out on a bench churchyards only to find

in one of our

a cold wind blowing against me and I didn't have a coat with me at all!

Easter has been and gone with its 4 day bank holiday weekend, chocolate eggs and bunnies, however in the life of the Church we are very much in the Easter season specifically remembering that Jesus rose again so that we might know new life, transformed life, life with God throughout eternity.

As part of the Easter season we read about Thomas, who was missing on the first evening after Jesus' resurrection, and wouldn't believe his fellow disciples about Jesus being risen from the dead.

Thomas said to them. "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

John 20:25

The account continues and we are back in the room with the disciples a week later, and this time Thomas is there when the risen Jesus again appears to them, and now Thomas believes.

Previously a polling company surveyed 2,010 British adults

eed for Pro

and found that 31 per cent of Christians believed the Bible's account of the Resurrection, rising to 57 per cent among those who attended a religious service at least once a month.

So there is a lot of doubt around... Adrian Plass the Christian author has commented about doubt: "Doubt: 1) more or less frequent visitor who should be allowed in when he knocks and sat down firmly in a corner. As long as he is neither fed nor entertained he will usually get bored after a while and go away 2) often a very useful stepping stone from one's old distorted image of God to something more like the real thing."

The Resurrection baffled Thomas just as it baffles us. What sort of person - what sort of object - are we dealing with here? The whole point is that it is the same Jesus. The marks of the nails in his hands. The wound in his side, big enough to get your hand into. This isn't a ghost. Nor is it someone pretending to be Jesus. This is him. This is the body the grave-clothes couldn't contain any longer.

This is central to the Christian faith. Happy continued Easter!

them 'a Comforter'. They were left alone, to wait at Jerusalem. And so they waited – on Him, and for Him.

They were not disappointed, for that morning the Holy Spirit fell upon that small room, and transformed those believers into the Church, Christ's body here on earth. Pentecost was not the first time that the Holv Spirit came to the world - throughout the Old Testament there are stories telling of how God had guided people and given them strength. But now His Spirit would use a new instrument: not just isolated prophets, but the Church, His body on earth.

Acts opens with the preaching of the gospel in Jerusalem, the centre of the Jewish nation. Within 30 years the Gospel had spread throughout the northern Mediterranean: Syria, Turkey, Greece, Malta... to the very heart of the Roman Empire: Rome. The Church was on the move – God was on the move! He was calling people from every nation to repent, turn to Jesus for forgiveness of their sins, and to follow Him.

News from Citizens Advice Swale

This month we're sharing some recent success stories from our specialist advice services. Our specialist debt team can help people deal with their debts and our approved intermediaries can process debt relief orders. Our specialist benefits advisers can ensure people receive what they are entitled to and help them challenge and appeal benefit decisions.

Client A

Our client has a number of medical conditions and is unable to read and write. She had been receiving PIP and reported a deterioration to her conditions. Her award was reviewed and it was decided she was no longer entitled to PIP. Our client

came to us for help with her appeal and was supported through the appeal process. She was awarded the enhanced rate of daily living and enhanced rate of mobility. She received £10,000 in arrears and ongoing will receive £627.60 every 4 weeks.

Client B

Our client wanted us to ask Swale Borough Council to write off a discretionary housing payment (DHP) overpayment. He is unable to afford to make payments. A payment plan of £40 per month was previously suggested by SBC but no payments were made as it was unaffordable. Our client did not deal with the DHP overpayment at the time he was informed about it due to his low mood and depression. He has no other debts. Our debt caseworker wrote to SBC to ask that they use their discretion to not recover, or to write off the debt. One week later SBC confirmed that the decision had been made not to recover the DHP payment for £5,400.

Beware your dog's tracker app

A number of apps which offer to keep an eye on your pet are also recording the login details and locations of YOU.

Such is the finding of a recent study. It seems that many tech companies which offer smart collars, GPS trackers, and wearable cameras for pets, may also be creating cyber security risks for their owners.

A recent study at Newcastle University and Royal Holloway, University of London, evaluated 40 such apps. It discovered that a good number of them were recording the login details and location of the owners without encryption. In addition, all but four of the apps included some sort of tracking software, which was gathering information on the owner, without their consent.

As one doctoral student at Newcastle University's school of computing explained, "Pet tech brings with it new security, privacy and safety risks to the pet owners.

"We would urge anyone using these apps to take the time to ensure they are using a unique password, check the settings and ensure that they consider how much data they are sharing or willing to share."
