#### Message for May

#### Hello friends

Here's an apparently random question to kick off with this month.....I wonder which you would consider to be the most important muscle of the body? I guess most people would say the heart and I wouldn't disagree. However of surely equal importance is the diaphragm. According to James Nestor, breathing expert 'The diaphragm is a jellyfish-shaped muscle that sits below the lungs and operates as the puppet master of our breathing. When we take a deep breath in, the diaphragm descends, enlarging and inflating the lungs with air. As we exhale, the diaphragm ascends, pushing the lungs together and forcing air out. This up-and-down motion of the diaphragm occurs forty to fifty thousand times a day, every day, from the moment we are born to the moment we breathe our last breath.' Wow! So we can see that without this muscle controlling the heart, the heart would be unable to function.

Breathing is so natural that we hardly give it a second thought until something happens to impede it. When we are in an enclosed environment and the air becomes stale, we are aware that our senses become dulled and our thinking becomes slow, and if something causes us to struggle for breath, things can become quite frightening.


The Hebrew word for breath is 'Ruach' and this is the word given in the first chapter of Genesis to describe God's spirit in creation 'the Spirit (Ruach) of God was hovering over the surface of the waters'. Later in Genesis the story goes that 'God, formed man (Adam) from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life'. There is a recognition here that breath – the thing that gives us life and keeps us alive – is an energy of God.

Later this month the church will

be celebrating the festival of Pentecost, so named as it takes places 50 days after Easter. This is often considered by Christians to mark the beginning of the Christian Church. It celebrates the time recorded in the book of Acts when God's Holy Spirit filled the followers of Jesus and gave life to their ministry. In part, they experienced this as a sudden invigorating gust of wind that blew through the whole house. Today we often speak of people who are enlivened with enthusiasm and positivity as a 'breath of fresh air'. We know how good fresh air is for our physical bodies – when our days are stale and

our thinking is foggy, we recognise that a blast of fresh air will re-invigorate us. And the same is true of our spiritual selves too. God's spirit is poured out for all of us bringing gifts of love, joy, peace, goodness, kindness, patience, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. It's there for the breathing in and the breathing out.

The Arts Society brings people together through a shared curiosity for the arts

We meet at Egerton Millennium Hall on the second Wednesday of each month at 2.30 p.m. (doors open from 2.00). Our next lecture will be:

Wednesday 8th May 'Uncompromising Genius: the life and work of Frank Lloyd Wright' by Fiona Rose

Frank Lloyd Wright (1857-1959) is recognized as one of the most important architects of all time. Over the course of his long career, he designed over 800 buildings including revolutionary structures such as The Guggenheim Museum, Fallingwater, the Johnson Wax Building and Taliesin. However, Wright's architectural achievements were often overshadowed by his turbulent private life. In his 92 years, he fathered 7 children, married three times, and suffered great personal tragedy. This illustrated lecture provides an overview of his work, colourful personal life and most iconic buildings.

Fiona Rose has been lecturing about topics she feels passionately about since 2010 including William Morris and his circle, the Arts & Crafts Movement, Frida Kahlo and Frank Lloyd Wright. She has a BA in Social Psychology and aims to include the human story behind the artistic endeavours of her subjects. Fiona is a volunteer Tour Guide with the Arts & Crafts gem The David Parr House.

#### Your local Women's Institute

Are you new to the area? The WI is a great opportunity to make friends and we are lucky to have one here based at Stalisfield!

The WI was founded in 1915 to revitalise rural communities and encourage women to become involved in producing food during the First World War. Since then the organisation aims have broadened and the WI is now the largest voluntary organisation in the UK.

Over the years the WI has campaigned for women's rights everywhere, helped with food preservation during World War 2, and raised issues of housing and homelessness. As far back as the 1970s it has pressured governments to protect the environment with recycling and anti pollution campaigns. The WI is non party political and actively encourages members involvement on issues that matter to them and their communities. The WI also plays a unique role in providing women with educational

opportunities and the chance to gain new skills with online courses and craft workshops. All members have free access to the WI website and a newly introduced site for education and learning with courses in the arts, crafts, wellbeing, fitness and technology.

Otterden and Stalisfield WI is a small group which meets on the first Wednesday of each month at Stalisfield village hall at 7.30pm.

Many village WIs have closed in recent years (8 in West Kent last year) and we would welcome some new members to keep our lovely group going. In addition to our varied meeting programme we arrange theatre trips, visits to gardens and other local attractions. Our meeting in April was presented by one of our members Marian Bond and her husband Andrew reading extracts from some of the hundreds of letters written by Andrew's parents while they were separated during WW2 which gave a real insight into social history of the time.



#### May 9th: Notes on Ascension Day

Surely the most tender, moving 'farewell' in history took place on Ascension Day. Luke records the story with great poignancy: "When Jesus had led them out to the vicinity of Bethany, he lifted up his hands - and blessed them."

As Christmas began the story of Jesus' life on earth, so Ascension Day completes it, with his return to his Father in heaven. Jesus' last act on earth was to bless his disciples. He and they had a bond as close as could be: they had just lived through three tumultuous years of public ministry and miracles – persecution and death - and resurrection! Just as we part from our nearest and dearest by still looking at them with love and memories in our eyes, so exactly did Jesus: "While He was blessing them. He left them and was taken up into heaven." (Luke 24:50-1) He was not forsaking them, but merely going on ahead to a kingdom which would also be theirs one day: "I am ascending to my Father and to your Father, to my God and your God ... " (John 20:17)

The disciples were surely the most favoured folk in history. Imagine being one of the last few people on earth to be face to face with Jesus, and have



Him look on you with love. No wonder then that Luke goes on: "they worshipped Him - and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. And they stayed continually at the temple, praising God." (Luke 24:52,53) No wonder they praised God! They knew they would see Jesus again one day! "I am going to prepare a place for you... I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am." (John 14:2,3) In the meantime, Jesus had work for them to do: to take the Gospel to every nation on earth.



#### KCC Councillor's column

It would be remiss of me not to write something about the subject which has been the talk of Swale for the past month – bins.

The problems we've seen with late, or in many cases entirely missed, collections across large parts of the borough have understandably generated a significant volume of calls to our customer service team and calls and emails to councillors. They have also generated a significant number of posts and comments on Facebook.

I am very sorry for the inconvenience and distress that this service has caused across the borough during the past month. The switchover has clearly been a failure, although possibly not to the degree that many would believe. There are large parts of the borough that have received a 'perfect' service so far, and it is primarily the rural areas which have been missed (in many cases consistently). I'd like to share the reasons why this is, and what Suez have been, and are continuing to do, to remedy the situation.



Firstly, to respond to a question which I've seen raised, the reason we no longer have a contract with *BIFFA* is simply that the contract

we had with them expired. Along with our partners in Ashford and Maidstone, we put out a tender and *SUEZ* was the only company to bid for that contract.

Some general reasons why the rounds are currently taking longer include:

New routes – the routes have been redrawn to be more efficient and resilient in the long term. We have more vehicles out in the same parts of the borough on the same day.

This means that when a crew member is suddenly unable to work, (this work has a higher rate of injury than most), or there is a vehicle breakdown, we have other vehicles nearby who can pick up the rest of that round. The completion of the new routes will get faster and more efficient with practice, but it may take a few weeks.

New processes – the crews now have handheld devices which can be used to register which properties have been collected from and which haven't. This additional piece of work may slow crews down as they get used to it, but in the long term will bring benefits in terms of more accurate data and a greater ability to send crews out to missed areas without them needing to be reported by the public.

The main reason the rural rounds have been hit disproportionately is that the new routes have not been assigned as efficiently as they should have been in terms of areas served by narrow lorries and those that have full-size lorries. There are large parts of the borough which can easily be navigated by the larger trucks and were under the previous contract. SUEZ have acknowledged this and are making changes to the routes to switch more properties and areas onto the fullsize trucks. This will greatly improve their ability to complete collection rounds.

SUEZ have also employed a number of new staff, both on the driver side and the loader side, and this week, (week beginning 15th April), we are beginning to see the effect of those additional staff and a much greater proportion of collections being completed on the scheduled day. I am hopeful that this trend will continue and that we will reach a state of normal service by early to mid-May.




