Canon's Column

November is a month of remembering. Its highlight for many people is the celebration of Bonfire Night when bonfires and fireworks are set off in celebration of the original aborted fireworks and fire planned by Guy Fawkes and his fellow conspirators who wanted to burn the Houses of Parliament and kill King James I on Nov. 5th 1605. The king and parliament were saved from a plot to destroy the government of the day.

Our remembering begins at the beginning of November with All Saints' Day on the first and All Souls' Day on the second. All Saints' Day was originally a day to remember 'the martyrs of the world' but was soon broadened to include all of the saints. One source defines saints as "Christians who, in various ways often against great odds, showed an extraordinary love for Christ." It continues, "the service they rendered in the past makes them examples to the rest of the people of God throughout history." In many churches, All Saints' Day is one of significant focus, remembering the great examples of our faith. The next day, Nov. 2nd, the church celebrates All Souls' Day when we remember those who have touched our own lives, the men and women and sometimes children from our own families and communities.

We will be having our All Souls' service at Stalisfield church on Sunday, Nov. 6th at 4p.m.

For many in our society, the November 11th, remembrance and the poppy are dramatically fused together as we remember those who were involved in the defence of our values and our country, those who died and those who were injured in body, soul and mind. It is not only a day for those who were involved, but for all of us who have benefited from the sacrifices of those men and women. It is also the opportunity for us to pray for the end of prejudice, hatred and violence and for peace in our world, peace that passes all understanding. Plan to join us at our Remembrance Sunday services.

At the regimental mess dinners of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, there is a table set with an empty place to honour the "fallen trooper", representing those who died or were killed on duty. The empty place is also part of the experience of those who have lost a family member and is particularly poignant at times such as Christmas, Thanksgiving and other family gatherings. In some cultures at certain festivals an extra place is laid at the dinner table for the "unseen guest". In the Jewish culture this is Elijah who could visit the faithful as a forerunner of the Messiah.

At the end of November we have Advent Sunday, the first of the

four Sundays leading to Christmas. This is a time of preparation for the coming of Christ. This year the Advent Sunday celebrations will be a joint gathering of all the churches and parishes in the deanery which will be held at West Faversham Community Centre. Look for the notice outlining the activities for the day and plan to join with our fellow Christians and with Archbishop Justin Welby for a time of worship and fellowship.

As we think about the unseen guest and about all who are being displaced and homeless, I would like to suggest that you might like to join in a growing practice of having Mary and Joseph visit your home for a night on their way to Bethlehem. The visit would consist of a representation of Mary and Joseph and a diary in which you could record your thoughts and experiences of providing a safe place for them on their journey. This could be a time to talk with children and grandchildren about some aspect of the coming of Jesus at Christmas and its affect upon us. For those who are interested, please email me (donaldjlawton@gmail.com) and I will start to make out a schedule of who Mary and Joseph visit and when. If there is enough interest, I will do a separate set-up for each of the communities. After your time with Mary and Joseph, you would deliver them to their next home of refuge. The other role is Gift Aid Secretary - we are fortunate to receive regular sums from members of the congregation on which we can claim gift aid. The Secretary records these transactions and completes gift aid returns, always after 5th April and 31st December and occasionally at other times.

The jobs are made easier through the use of online banking. Each would suit someone with a few spare hours every few months. You don't have to be an accountant, however, some computer literacy and access to the internet would be welcome.

Christmas Trees 2016

Thanks to your support in 2015, we're pleased to report that, for 250 trees, donations totalling £10,095 was raised and is being given to 45 parishes in this area, and 20 national charities as listed: Kidney Research; Cancer Research; Maggie's Cancer Caring Centres; Macmillan Cancer Support; Marie Curie Cancer Care; Pilgrim's Hospices; Samaritans; Help for Heros; Alzheimer's Society; Motor Neurone Disease Association; Cystic Fibrosis Trust; Demelza Kent; British Heart Foundation; Brain Tumour UK; British Heart Foundation; Pancreatic Cancer Action; Parkinsons UK; MS society; Prostrate Cancer; Walking with the Wounded.

Although we had good growing conditions in the spring but dry in the summer and autumn there should be available a reasonable number of trees of the traditional Norwegian spruce in the 4ft to 8ft range and even some taller. Also available will be some softer blue tinge Serbian spruce of the same size with also some a little taller.

Please phone or email us to fix a time and date, preferably at weekends, to visit to select prior to collection nearer Christmas. The trees are growing and will stay in the ground until collected so they stay fresher for longer. Trees will be available for selection from SATURDAY 5th NOVEMBER. PLEASE CONTACT US TO TELL US WHEN YOU'D LIKE TO COME!

As before, the arrangement is for you to make a donation for your tree; half is returned to your parish church with the balance going to the 20 named charities.

This is a great chance for you to raise funds for your parish church, and some deserving charities at the same time.

The Southern Alsatian Training Society held our Kennel Club Licensed Working Dog Trial in this area for the fourth year running. We used Stalisfield Village Hall as a Base, the hall being



much admired by all attending. Stubble fields were provided by Eric Baker of Hurst Farm for the lower Stakes and grass fields provided by David & Julie Murray of Snoad Farm for the top Stake. The Plough Inn provided the caravan site and also the use of their paddock in which we tested the dog's Control and Agility. As a Society, and personally, we cannot thank you all enough for your help providing facilities for us to run this annual event.

For those of you who may be interested in our sport, it is the civilian equivalent of Police Dog Trials. The dogs must be very fit, under a high degree of control, and whilst Tracking worked on a harness and line in the fields. The dogs must only follow human scent, ignore any game scents and do not disturb or harm any wildlife either. The area required for each dog to work a track is up to 10 acres, so you will see just how much we rely on the goodwill of the local farmers! 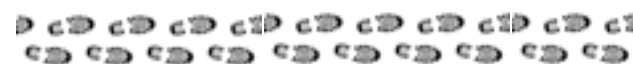

Mark Withers talks about THE REBIRTH OF PARIS 1853-69

In 1848 the exiled Prince Louis-Napoléon Bonaparte returned to be elected President of the second French Republic, later becoming Emperor Napoléon III. To realise his vision of a glorious France, with its capital a latter-day Rome, he appointed Georges Haussmann to rebuild medieval Paris, transforming it at great expense into the spacious modern city we see today. In 1870 Haussmann was sacked; and shortly after, following the disastrous outcome of the Franco-Prussian war, the Emperor himself was exiled again.
