Journeying...

Just a couple of days before I write this I went on a journey - a different sort of journey than normal, although it did involve 2 trains to get home again. Bob Prichard and I went out sailing in his boat, out to the Red Sands Forts off Whitstable, that were positioned there to guard the mouth of the Thames during the second world war.

In a couple of days time I will be going on a completely different journey with Jane and a couple of good friends as we get the train to Amsterdam, to spend a few days there on holiday.

Two very different journeys, but nevertheless journeys in themselves. We undertake many different journeys, no doubt of many different types.

The last 15 years has been a particular journey, part of the journey of life for Jane and myself, based in Teynham, initially as Cluster leader of the Kingsdown & Creekside cluster, before that cluster of 7 parishes became the single Parish of Kingsdown & Creekside and I became its first Rector.

Meanwhile I became Area Dean of Ospringe in November 2011 and in that role got to know the parishes that went on to make up the Parish of High Downs in two Interregnums, both of which included a Confirmation Service at Eastling! However, it has been a privilege to be journeying with both Parishes, together, since 2019

What a journey it has been, as we have sought to be God's church in our localities and communities. Ups and Downs at different times, but nevertheless journeying with God in all HE has had for us over these years. A journey that has known many blessings.

One of the greater encouragements has been the willingness of so many to use their gifts to the benefit of us all, in so many different roles in our churches across the benefice. So I say thank you to you all for us all being alongside one another in this journey with Jesus as his Church in our villages. We use the term, in the Church of England, Lav Ministry, but this is about the ministry of the Church and there is no real division between lay and ordained, however much the structures try to suggest otherwise!

For our time together has all been about a journey with God. We have been about putting Jesus at the centre of all we are as his Church. We haven't always nailed that aspiration but my prayer is that the Churches in their benefice, in other words the people who gather together in our various places of worship are intent in that aim, placing Jesus in the centre of our lives, in the centre of our life as his Church.



Through that comes the outworking of God in our lives, the God of love enabling the sharing of his love with each other.



Several of our members had brought along wedding photographs for us all to look at, either their own wedding or other family members through the generations, including marriages during wartime.

Our earliest photograph displayed was during WW1, with several of the menfolk in uniform. It was also common for the same bridal gown to be worn by sisters and cousins, but we noticed that the bouquets then were very large, often extending from the bride's waist right down to the floor. It was fascinating to see the changes of bridal groups



and fashions over the years, and how bridal photography had become more informal compared to the early 1900s.

Updates from Citizens Advice Swale September 2023

A new school year can put pressure on lots of people's budgets, and if you're feeling the squeeze at the moment you're not alone in your worries. But there is help available.



School lunches: The help you can get to cover school lunches will vary depending on how old your children are and if you claim benefits. Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 automatically get free school meals. You can apply for free school meals for older children if you claim certain types of benefits, including Universal Credit, Child

citizens

Tax Credit and Income Support. There is also local support available during the school holidays, for example the Faversham Umbrella are currently offering free lunch boxes for school children.

Travel costs: If your child can't walk to school because of special educational needs or disabilities they should get free school transport. You may be able to get help with transport costs from Kent County Council if your children can't walk because it's dangerous or too far.

School uniform: Local charitable schemes may be able to help, for example the Community Wardrobes from Sheppey Matters and Sittingbourne Methodist Church. There may also be donations and second-hand sales available through the school itself or Parent Teacher Association (PTA).



God in the Sciences

How can a Christian be a scientist?

I used to ask this question as a student. I wondered what it was like to have a career in science, and how being a Christian might make a difference. Eventually I met a good number of successful scientists who were sincere Christians, and I learned that science and faith are a great combination. Dr Francis Collins, former Director of the project to decode the whole of human DNA, wrote that it is "possible for the scientist-believer to be intellectually fulfilled and spiritually alive, both worshipping God and using the tools of science to uncover some of the awesome mysteries of His creation." So, what do people like this make of the opportunities and challenges of a life in science?

Although our beliefs may affect what we notice about the world and how we interpret our data. they don't affect the outcome of the experiments themselves. If a Muslim and a Christian drop the same ball from the same height under identical conditions, it will fall at the same speed. This means that a scientist can be respected by her colleagues for doing good work, regardless of what she believes and what her colleagues think of her worldview.

Science is an exercise in observing and measuring things, and coming up with general principles about the way things are. The world has been declared by God to be 'very good' (see chapter one and two of Genesis), and exploring it is a way to express our gratitude to Him. Scientific discoveries can also bring a sense of awe and wonder that feeds into our worship.

Some people don't want to get involved in certain lines of research because of ethical concerns. On the other hand, there are many issues that make Christians want to get stuck into new research that will help care for people and the rest of creation, such as medical research, ecology or developing appropriate technologies.

Organisations such as Christians in Science and the Faraday Institute gather together scientists who are also people of faith, and others who are interested in the subject. They come from a wide range of backgrounds, and express their beliefs in a variety of different ways. What they have in common is the conviction that you don't have to choose between science and God. As the young people in our churches prepare to return to their studies, online if not in person, let's encourage them that science (along with many other fields) is a great way to serve God.

The Divine Gardener

This is the time of year for many churches to hold their Harvest Festival services. No doubt, there will be displays of food, some grown in local gardens. While gardeners have pleasure growing fruit and vegetables, it can be hard work tending to them.

Jesus knew about the care given to vines. In John 15:1-8 Jesus compared Himself to a vine and referred to God as the gardener. In this parable, God is responsible for pruning the vine. He sees what parts are useful, and what parts useless. The unproductive parts are cut away, so that growth is encouraged. Jesus is telling us that God will prune our lives, not to harm us, but to encourage our spiritual growth.

God's pruning cuts away wrong attitudes and wasteful behaviour, all of which serve no useful purpose in our lives. This pruning by Lester Amann.

is required so that we become more fruitful. And the fruit God wants is love, joy, patience etc. (see Galatians 5:22-23) These holy qualities are intended to influence the world to change it from the bad to all that is good. To encourage its growth, a vine has regularly to be cut back. The effect looks drastic, but it is still essential. When God cuts away the dead wood in our lives, He does it because He knows how our lives can grow. The pruning knives are in the hands of our Father God who only desires the best for us. This pruning process can be painful, but Jesus says that it is vital if the Holy Spirit is to flow


through us to produce the fruit that

Also in this parable, Jesus said He was the Vine, and we are the branches. We have no existence apart from Jesus. We can do nothing for God on our own and must be joined to Jesus. In the same way a vine utilises the lifegiving sap to flow into the branches, so we need the Holy Spirit to flow His life into us. It is only by us remaining in Jesus, that He can give us the inner resources for an effective fruit-producing life.

Jesus said, 'Abide in Me' (John 15:4 King James Version). Abiding speaks of sustenance, being upheld and supported, enduring and withstanding. So, if we are to reap a harvest of holiness, may we be prepared for God's pruning, and continue to abide in Jesus, our Lord and Saviour.









How to fight back against artificial intelligence

I've been writing Christian comment columns for newspapers and radio for more than 30 years – but I had a shock when I asked an artificial intelligence computer programme to write one for me.

The question that I posed was simple. Could an AI programme produce a column that would match up to one penned by a team of writers who regularly produce articles for a local newspaper in St Albans, my home city north of London? These are all people who know the area and have a living faith.

The answer? The AI fared pretty well and – worryingly – it produced several insights that could have been written by one of our experienced team.

My experiment with artificial intelligence gave me a glimpse of what AI can already do, with looking ahead – the potential for 'systems with human-intelligence' to make radical changes to society, including taking away people's jobs and making 'fake news' much easier to invent and distribute.

Many people are worried. A group of technology leaders have called

for a pause in development while we study AI's potential impact.

But what 'my' AI-generated article lacked – and, of course, it would – was a living faith that would inform its writing. For anyone who is a Christian communicator – from the pulpit, online, in print, via video or drama or in our personal lives – this is a vital lesson.

In an age when AI can generate sermons, write articles and design compelling graphics, those of us who seek to speak about the faith, and bring others to it, will need increasingly to 'bring ourselves' into our messages.

Like John the Baptist, we need to be pointing to Christ – always – but it'll become increasingly vital that we bring our own lived experiences, our testimonies, into how we communicate.

That's the challenge for all Christian communicators, and anyone seeking to share their faith. Words and arguments that could be drawn from a text-book or the web can easily be replicated by AI programmes.

Actions of love, and sharing our personal story will always be the most persuasive way of presenting Christ's gospel of sacrifice and love.

And AI - I pray – will never be able to match that authenticity and truth.




